Re: People v. Idris Jamerson

Today, in Department 16 of the Solano County Superior Court, before the Honorable Scott L. Kays, the jury found the defendant, Idris Jamerson, guilty of Pimping and Pandering in violation of Penal Code Sections 266h(a) and 266i(a). On May 19, 2017, the Vacaville Police Vice Unit in partnership with the FBI Violent Crime Task Force, conducted a Human Trafficking sting operation. While working in an undercover capacity, Detective Lopez contacted the poster of an ad on Back Page who appeared to be an underage female selling sexual services. Detective Lopez arranged to have the female come to the apartment complex, where the police had set up their operation, for a date. The defendant was caught while driving the young woman to the date. A subsequent search of the woman's cell phone led to evidence demonstrating the defendant's involvement in recruiting the young woman to prostitute for him and his involvement as her pimp. He is scheduled to be sentenced on October 30, 2017, at 9 a.m. in Department 16.



Detective Stephen Lopez with the Vacaville Police Vice Unit and Detective Mike Miller with the FBI Violent Crime Task Force investigated the case. The case was prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney Susan A. Rados.
