Re: People v. Marion Allen and Terri Wilson (FCR338492/FCR338494)

On June 21, 2018, a specially convened Solano County Criminal Grand Jury returned a 39-count felony indictment against Defendants Marion Allen and Terri Wilson. Defendants were indicted on one count of felony Conspiracy to Commit a Crime and 38 felony counts of Grand Theft stemming from activities alleged to have occurred while they were employees of Recology's Hay Road Landfill.

Between the period of November 14, 2015 through December 30, 2015, defendants are alleged to have accepted cash bribes from waste haulers in exchange for allowing trucks to bypass Recology's inbound truck scales and point of sale system at the Hay Road Landfill. The charges were brought by the District Attorney's Office after an internal forensic audit by Recology revealed that the alleged bypass events were occurring when Defendants Marion Allen and Terri Wilson were working as weighmasters in the inbound scale house. Subsequent search warrants executed on their residences recovered \$93,057.00 in cash from the home of Marion Allen in Fairfield, as well as \$154,919.00 in cash from the home of Terri Wilson in Esparto, CA.

Defendants were arraigned on the indictment on June 27, 2018, and are currently scheduled for a trial readiness conference in Department 17 of the Solano County Superior Court on July 18, 2018. Marion Allen posted a bail bond and Terri Wilson was granted supervised release through Pre-Trial Services. This case is being prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney Matthew Olsen and Deputy District Attorney Janice Williams. This case was investigated by the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigations.
