

Black History Month moment



US astronaut, doctor and engineer Mae Jemison became the first Black woman to go into space in 1992. She was one of seven crew aboard the Space Shuttle Endeavour, on a mission named STS-47.

The youngest of three children, Jemison was born in Decatur, Alabama, but moved to Chicago, Illinois, at the age of three. Partly

inspired by a love of *Star Trek*, she aspired to go into space and was sure she would get there. "As a little girl... I always assumed I would go into space," she said in a 2017 interview "Let me make sure that's clear: I just always assumed, despite the fact that the US hadn't sent any women up there, or people of color, that I was going to go." Little did she know then that she would also one day become the first real astronaut to appear in an episode of *Star Trek*.

A determined student, Jemison received a scholarship to attend Stanford University at the age of just 16, where she studied degrees in chemical engineering and African and African American studies. After graduating, she continued her education at Cornell University Medical College in New York, getting her medical degree in 1981, and later worked as a general practitioner, spending several years in the Peace Corps in West Africa. She also pursued graduate courses in engineering.

Following in the footsteps of Sally Ride, who became the first American woman in space in 1983, Jemison applied to join NASA's astronaut training program. She was one of 15 accepted out of around 2000 applicants in 1986.

Jemison was the science mission specialist on the STS-47 Spacelab-J flight, which in 1992 spent eight days in space from 12 to 20 September. During the mission, 44 life science and materials processing experiments were carried out by the crew while orbiting Earth 126 times.

Jemison now acts as a science ambassador and speaks about the need to democratize access to technology for the future of humanity. She also wants to make sure that science and technology are accessible to all, and has worked to empower young women to engage with STEM and pursue careers in these areas, including acting as Bayer Corporation US's national science literacy ambassador and chairing a US government committee to address this issue.

The Solano County Probation Department will host a screening of "The 50" on Friday, March 15, at 5pm, at the Empress Theatre, 330 Virginia Street in Vallejo.

This event is supported by a federal grant under the Opioid Response program, with funding provided by the California Department of Healthcare Services.

The film documents the first 50 men to complete the California State Prison Solano Occupational Mentor Certification Program (OMCP), and takes us through their journey to become Certified Substance Abuse Counselors while incarcerated.

Several of the certified counselors work locally with Solano County youth so this presents an exciting opportunity for young people to learn from those with lived experiences and likely similar environmental experiences.

Solano County Agricultural Grant



The Solano County Agriculture Grant will fund 63 eligible farm businesses in Solano County with a grant of \$5,000 each. The grants are for farm and agricultural businesses impacted by the COVID-19 in Solano County

Applications are open to Feb. 29, 2024. The first round of recipients will be notified starting mid-February 2024.


The grant is provided by the County of Solano, in partnership with the Solano County Farm Bureau, the Workforce Development Board (WDB) of Solano County and the Solano-Napa Small Business Development Center (SBDC), using funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (APRA).

To be eligible for the \$5,000 grant award, your farm or agricultural business MUST MEET ALL the following 6 criteria:

- 1. Be currently operating business and was open on or prior to Jan. 31, 2021
- 2. Be currently based in Solano County
- 3. Have had 2021 gross revenue under \$400,000
- 4. Have a county business license, an Ag Pass, OR follows the same criteria as qualifications for an Ag Pass
- 5. Attest to negative impacts from the COVID-19 pandemic
- 6. Be an agricultural business that falls under one of the following industry codes/categories:
 - o 1111 Oil Seed and Grain Farming
 - 1112 Vegetable and Melon Farming
 - 1113 Fruit and Tree Nut Farming
 - 1114 Greenhouse, Nursery and Floriculture Production
 - 1119 Other Crop Farming
 - 1121 Cattle Ranching and Farming
 - 1122 Hog and Pig Farming
 - 1123 Poultry and Egg Production
 - 1124 Sheep and Goat Farming
 - o 1125 Aquaculture
 - 1129 Other Animals Production
 - o 1151 Support Activities for Crop Production

Volunteer architects from around the region are committed to participating and sketching designs in real-time for area residents and developers to get a glimpse of Benicia Road's potential future. This is the first-time Solano County Planning will be hosting this type of workshop which is more widely known as a design charrette.

The focus area is between Glen Cove Road/Rollingwood Drive and Homeacres Avenue.

Notice of Public Availability of Refinery Flare Minimization Plan Annual Updates

BAY AREA AIR QUALITY The Bay Area Air Quality
MANAGEMENT DISTRICT Management District is releasing
the 2022 Flare Minimization Plan (FMP) Annual Updates for public

review and comment. The five Bay Area refineries prepared these plans subject to Regulation 12, Rule 12: Flares at Refineries.

Under Regulation 12-12, each FMP Annual Update must include:

- New prevention measures identified during investigations of flaring events that occurred during the period July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022;
- A description of the prevention measures previously taken or currently planned to reduce flare emissions at the refinery;
- Commitment to implement all new feasible prevention measures expeditiously; and
- A 30-day public comment review period

The plan updates are now available for review on the Air District's <u>Flare Minimization Plans</u> web page.

The deadline to submit public comments regarding the 2022 FMP Annual Updates is **Monday**, **February 26**.

Be sure to identify which refinery, or refineries, your comment is applicable to.

After consideration of public comments received, the Air District will evaluate each refinery's Flare Minimization Plan Annual Update to determine whether it meets the requirements of Regulation 12-12 and will take final action in accordance with the regulation.

Federal Review of MTC's Role in the Bay Area



Every four years, the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) must certify that each metropolitan planning

organization (MPO) serving a transportation management area (TMA) — a designation by DOT of an urbanized area with a population over 200,000 as defined by the Bureau of the Census or smaller urbanized areas on request by the Governor and MPO — is carrying out the metropolitan planning process in adherence with federal statutes and regulations. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) conduct a review of the metropolitan planning process within each TMA and jointly issue this certification on behalf of the DOT Secretary, in accordance with 49 U.S.C. 5303(k).

The FHWA and the FTA are hosting a public meeting as part of MTC's certification review. This public meeting is an opportunity for Bay Area residents to directly address FHWA and FTA officials concerning your views on the transportation planning process in the San Francisco—Oakland metropolitan area. Updates from around Solano County

Design Work Begins on the Lopes Road & Waterline Reconstruction Project



Earlier this month, the Fairfield City Council awarded a contract to Dewberry Engineers Inc. to provide engineering and environmental services for the Lopes Road & Waterline Reconstruction Project in accordance with an MOU with the city of Benicia.

In March 2023, the hillside west of Lopes Road in Fairfield became saturated from rainstorms, causing a failure in Lopes Road that broke Benicia's waterline, which delivers all drinking water to the city, and damaged/closed the roadway.

Pre-design work in the form of soil investigations, local permitting and identification of certain environmental and historic preservation requirements have already begun. Benicia officials will be closely involved in the project development and review. Preliminary restoration designs and environmental clearance documents are expected in the next few months with final design and permitting to follow in an expedited manner.

First 5 Solano Request for Applications

The First 5 Solano Children and Families Commission (First 5 Solano) has released its Request for Application



("RFA #2024-01) for its Annual Grants Program.

The Annual Grants Fund is designed for one-time projects to address the needs of children ages 0-5, their parents/caregivers, and/or providers of services to children ages 0-5 in Solano County.

The Commission has committed up to \$120,000 in annual grants for FY2024/25. Multiple grants of up to \$20,000 each will be awarded for up to a 1-year period from July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025.

Applications will be accepted for a wide variety of activities that align with the First 5 Solano Strategic Plan Framework and address a gap in services, address a community disparity, and/or address a time sensitive community need.

A <u>mandatory</u> letter of intent is due by February 12 and applicants must also attend a <u>mandatory</u> grant development session. The complete application is due by **March 11 at 5pm**.





Mare Island Historic Park Foundation as they present the story of


Vallejo's own nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarine. Built at Mare Island during the crucible of the Cold War, the submarine was the most powerful warship on earth built and manned under the highest national priority to address an existential threat to our nation.

In 1957, the Soviet leader slammed his shoe on the podium at an international conference and vowed to bury the West. The USS Mariano G. Vallejo (SSBN 658) had but one purpose: to prevent a Soviet preemptive nuclear attack. Her mission was to ensure that any attempt at a nuclear first strike by the Soviets would result in an unstoppable Armageddon being unleashed upon them.

Movers & Shakers Breakfast Summit



Events I attended this week

Tuesday, February 20, I attended the Benicia City Council meeting. The council honored Police Chief Mike Greene upon his retirement from the City of Benicia. Marianne Butler from the Solano RCD (Resource Conservation District) did a wonderful presentation promoting their outdoor program for the students. The

program is free and shows students why water is important. It is important to keep our environment clean. I have gone with students (Benicia Middle School and Hogan Middle School) when they explored Rush Ranch and the marsh. There is a program for teachers to learn about water in the state and the county. We learn about the state water project and how Lake Berryessa came to be and the importance to Solano County.
