PURPOSE STATEMENT – Community Corrections Partnership

The mission of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) is to discuss issues related to the implementation of various pieces of state legislation that focus on adult criminal offenders, including the realignment of many state public safety functions to local jurisdictions. The overall objective is to reduce the recidivism rate of adult offenders in the local criminal justice system.

Membership of the CCP is outlined in California Penal Code section 1230 and defined by the Community Corrections Performance Incentive Act of 2009 (SB 678) and includes the Chief Probation Officer (Chair)*, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court* or his or her designee, a County Supervisor or County Administrator, District Attorney*, Public Defender*, Sheriff*, the head of the Department of Social Services*, the head of the County Department of Mental Health, the head of the County Department of Employment, the head of the County Alcohol and Substance Abuse programs, the County Superintendent of Education, a local chief of police*, a representative of a community-based organization with experience in successfully providing rehabilitative services to persons convicted of criminal offenses, and an individual who represents the interests of victims.

Through AB 109/AB117 the CCP is responsible for recommending a local plan to the county Board of Supervisors (BOS) for the implementation of public safety realignment. This legislation also established an Executive Committee within the CCP. Each Executive Committee member is identified with an asterisk (*) above. The Executive Committee is responsible for approving the local plan for recommendation to the BOS.

Chief Hansen welcomed everyone and thanked them for coming.

Approval of Agenda

The motion of Superintendent Estrella-Henderson to approve the agenda was seconded by Lesli Caldwell and adopted by the following vote: 10 in favor, 0 (zero) opposing and 0 (zero) abstaining.

Public Comment: Renee Smith was very pleased to announce the first Adult MIOCR Graduation which took place on Wednesday April 19th.

Approval of Minutes

The motion of Lesli Caldwell to approve the Minutes was seconded by Andy Williamson and adopted by the following vote: 10 in favor, 0 (zero) opposing and 0 (zero) abstaining.

Demographic Information: (See PowerPoint – Probation Department, Sheriff's Office and Health & Social Services Data Presentation April 26, 2017.)

- Dean Wilder presented demographical information regarding grant type and city of residence pertaining to the Realignment population.
- Amy Potter presented demographic information pertaining to the Pretrial program.
- Chief Hansen provided the current Jail population trend at 910 inmates.

Public Comments Regarding the Demographic Information:

Dr. Schussel would like to see percentages related to the probation population demographics and city of residence as well as Pretrial Demographics.

Center for Positive Change Panel Presentation: Kathleen Nunez introduced three (3) clients who are currently or who have been former clients of the CPC. John McDevitt, Robert Patterson and Kelly Roach all gave testimonies as to how the CPC helped them change their lives and change their behaviors in an effort to keep them from recidivating. They are all doing very well and expressed gratitude to the staff at the CPC and LCA for continuing to help them strive to be better patrons in the community.

Employment Services Update: Jennifer Jaye and Suzanne Lopez from LCA gave a presentation regarding Employment Services through Probation and the Sheriff's Office. LCA's goal is to partner with employees in the community who may not otherwise hire our population and provide them with on the job training. LCA has provided services to 224 participants at the Probation Department since July 2016. A total of 130 have obtained employment, are paying taxes and have medical benefits. A total of 59% of the LCA participants who have completed the program have obtained employment.

Budget Update: Ian Goldberg gave an update on the Public Safety Realignment Budget and asked the committee to consider recommending to the Board of Supervisors programs and services that total \$13.6 million for FY 2017/18 utilizing AB109 funding.

The motion of Lesli Caldwell to recommend the Budget request to the Board of Supervisors as detailed by Ian Goldberg was seconded by Superintendent Estrella-Henderson and adopted by the following vote: 8 in favor, 0 (zero) opposing and 1 (one) abstaining.

Results First Presentation: Amalia Mejia and Darby Kernan gave a presentation regarding the Results First Initiative and PEW study. Results First is a national initiative currently working with 22 states and six (6) counties; the project helps state and local government leaders identify and invest in programs that are not only proven to work in their jurisdictions, but also endorse the effort to review the pieces of operations under AB109 with the key departments, and recommend to the Board of Supervisors to formalize a partnership with CSAC-Results First.

The motion of Deanna Allen to recommend formalizing a partnership with CSAC-Results First to the Board of Supervisors was seconded by Judge Fracchia and adopted by the following vote: 9 in favor, 0 (zero) opposing and 0 (zero) abstaining.
