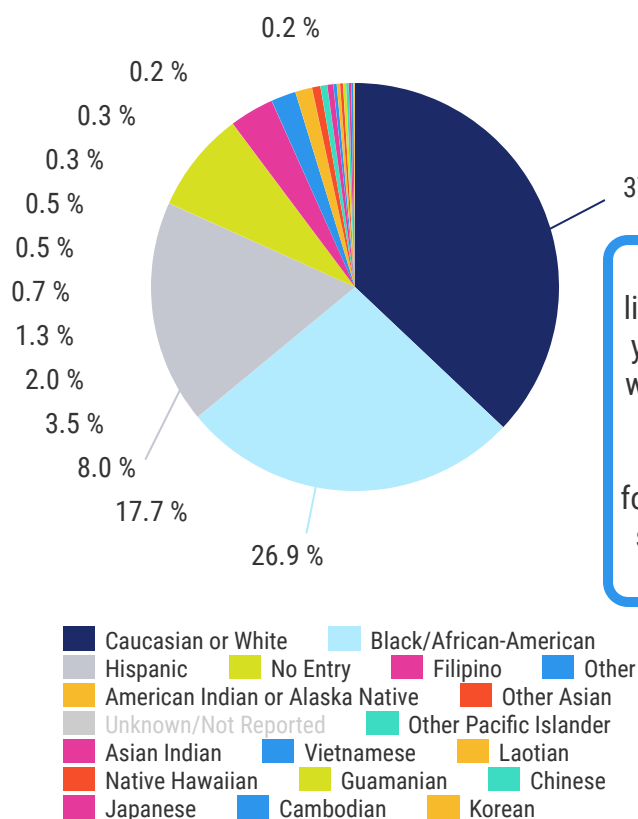

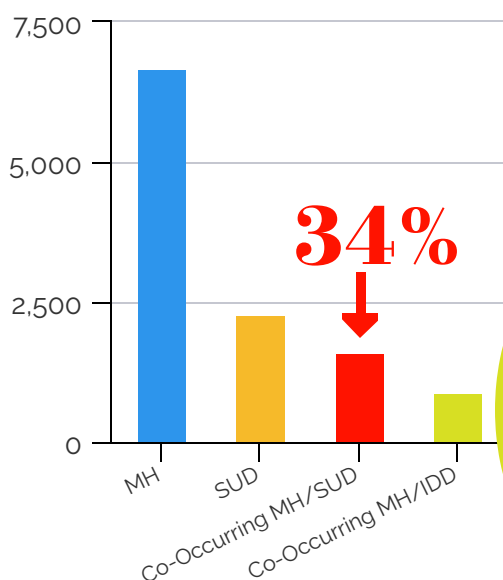

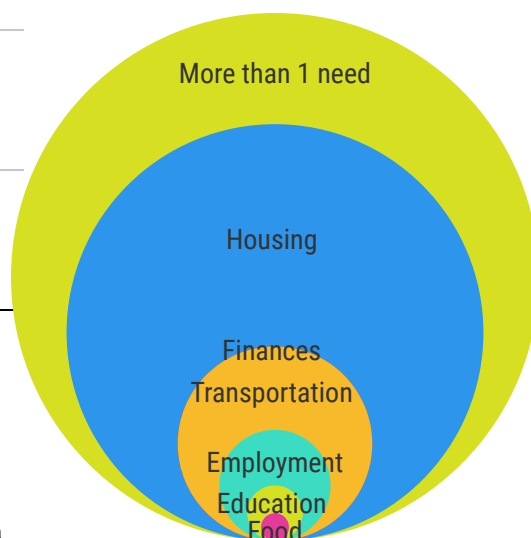

Community Events

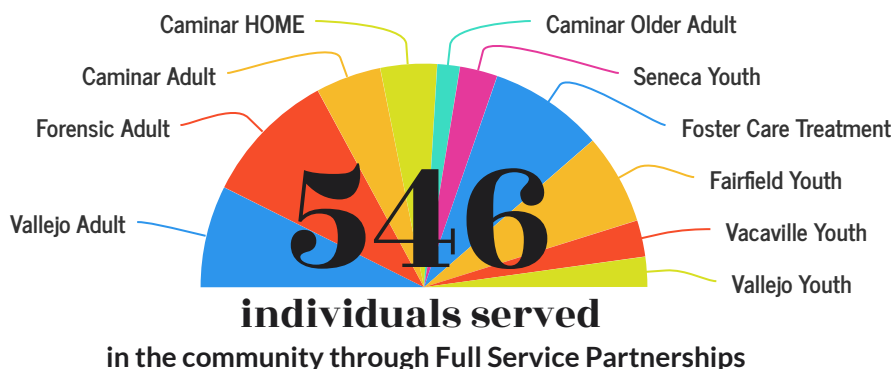
- ✓ **1st Annual Recovery Month Celebration**
 - SEPT 2017: over 60 peers and providers from substance abuse services and mental health attended to share empowering recovery stories and offer hope.
- ✓ **Regional Peer Services Forum**
 - FEB 2018: Co-sponsored with CAMHPRO. Over 150 peers and community members across 17 counties in attendance to discuss Wellness, Recovery and Peer Support with SB906.
- ✓ **3rd Annual Mental Health Month Event**
 - MAY 2018: MHSA Wellness Recovery Team hosted a community event with Seneca. Resource tables, lunch and awards were presented. Over 100 people were in attendance.

PROP 47

H&SS received a \$6 million grant to grow a housing and support network for Substance Abuse Services clients with criminal histories. Treatment without supportive services, like housing, is not as effective. Nearly all of our clients need help with a lot more than just their drug and/or alcohol problem, and the Prop 47 funding supports them.

Continuum of Care Reform

Began implementing the Presumptive Transfer process & received 99 referrals from 15 different counties in partnership with Child Welfare Services and Probation; also participated with MH, CWS, and Probation staff from 11 regional counties for implementation.

DUAL DIAGNOSIS GROUP

Substance Abuse Services started a new dual-diagnosis, intensive outpatient treatment group that lasts for 12 weeks and helps meet a need for services that heretofore have not been consistently available in Solano.

SCBH decreased bed days in IMD (locked facilities) by 13% & stepped down 75% more people than last year

Initiatives for FY 18-19

- Implement the California Integrated Practice CANS assessments for all children/youth with open CWS cases starting in FY 18-19
- Expand community housing:
 - No Place Like Home & other grants
 - Prop 47 Housing Supports
 - Housing Tracking for step downs from higher levels of care
- Integration of mental health & substance use services to expand co-occurring capacity
- Implement Therapeutic Foster Care services & identify Foster Family Agencies in coordination with Child Welfare
- Expand the peer workforce through hiring and embedding of Peer Specialists in services
- Expand evidence base practices through ACT model, Supported Employment, and others
- Grow our clinical program evaluation and support in QI team
