

Purpose: Solano African American/Black

Community Resources Guide

Solano County is one of the top diverse counties in California. Approximately 14 percent of the County's population identify as Black or African American¹. Community data has indicated that the African American or Black community is experiencing disparate health and socio-economic outcomes compared to other local communities. For example, according to the California Department of Education, African American or Black k-12 students have the highest suspension rate (13.8%); **nearly 2.4 times the County rate, and three times the rate of white students.**² Solano County Health & Social Services (H&SS) has recently convened a series of staff caucuses to discuss strategies to address disparate health and socioeconomic outcomes that are occurring in the local African American community. The H&SS African American/Black Caucus has generated this guide to increase access to culturally-specific community-based programs and services with the intent to provide additional protective factors in the Black community; to close the gaps of disparate outcomes experienced by Solano African Americans.


