PURPOSE STATEMENT – Community Corrections Partnership

The mission of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) is to discuss issues related to the implementation of various pieces of state legislation that focus on adult criminal offenders, including the realignment of many state public safety functions to local jurisdictions. The overall objective is to reduce the recidivism rate of adult offenders in the local criminal justice system.

Membership of the CCP is outlined in California Penal Code section 1230 and defined by the Community Corrections Performance Incentive Act of 2009 (SB 678) and includes the Chief Probation Officer (Chair)*, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court* or his or her designee, a County Supervisor or County Administrator, District Attorney*, Public Defender*, Sheriff*, the head of the Department of Social Services*, the head of the County Department of Mental Health, the head of the County Department of Employment, the head of the County Alcohol and Substance Abuse programs, the County Superintendent of Education, a local chief of police*, a representative of a community-based organization with experience in successfully providing rehabilitative services to persons convicted of criminal offenses, and an individual who represents the interests of victims.

Through AB 109/AB117 the CCP is responsible for recommending a local plan to the county Board of Supervisors (BOS) for the implementation of public safety realignment. This legislation also established an Executive Committee within the CCP. Each Executive Committee member is identified with an asterisk (*) above. The Executive Committee is responsible for approving the local plan for recommendation to the BOS.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP):

- 1. Receive an update on the 2011 Public Safety Realignment Budget; and
- Consider and recommend to the Board of Supervisors programs and services that total \$14.8 million for FY2022/23 utilizing AB109 funding, including a new estimated allocation of \$17.2 million in 2011 Public Safety Realignment revenue (AB109) to continue to advance concepts in the adopted 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act Implementation Plan.

SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

The 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act (AB109 and companion legislation) redirected from the State of California (State) to counties specific duties and responsibilities associated with the sentencing and supervision of individuals convicted of felony offenses. This legislation changed sentencing practices, shifted responsibility for the housing of convicted non-violent offenders and parole violators to the counties, and shifted responsibility for supervising paroled non-violent, non-serious, and non-sex (non-non-non) offenders to county probation departments.

The Board of Supervisors, in compliance with the new mandates, approved the Solano Public Safety Realignment Act Implementation Plan on November 1, 2011 (2011 Plan) as prepared and recommended by the CCP. Since November 2011, the Board of Supervisors has received reports and recommendations from the Solano Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) on the timing and sequencing of the implementation of the 2011 Plan. The Board has approved a number of new positions, professional service and consultant service contracts, training, equipment purchases, and other related expenses needed to support the implementation of the approved 2011 Public Safety Realignment Plan.

Solano County Departments have requested continued funding for the programs and services previously supported by the CCP for FY2022/23. An overview of the respective Departments' FY2022/23 programs and related costs are outlined in the Discussion section herein.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The total funding available in FY2022/23 for Solano County under 2011 Public Safety Realignment is \$25.4 million. This total includes \$8.2 million in unspent carryforward from previous years (based on Midyear department projections for spending in FY2021/22) and an estimated State allocation of \$17.2 million in FY2022/23, at this time there is no Growth Allocation estimated for FY2022/23.

2011 Public Safety Realignment funding from the State for Community Corrections consists of an annual base allocation and a possible growth allocation, which is based on a formula to share growth in the State funding source. The growth funds are dependent on the State's sales tax and VLF collections and are allocated based on performance measures based primarily on incarceration rates and Probation success rates. The 2011 Public Safety Realignment fiscal year period is August 16 through August 15. The projected spending at Midyear reflects savings resulting from the timing in filling staff vacancies and other one-time reductions in expense in AB109 departments.

The FY2022/23 Requested Budget for AB109 is \$14.8 million, which represents an increase of \$950,000 when compared to the FY2021/22 Adopted Budget. This increase is primarily due to negotiated and approved labor contract wage increases, CalPERS retirement costs, and changes in health benefit costs and workers compensation rates.

In recent years, departments receiving AB109 funding have made significant effort in reducing and/or containing costs and some years relied on the use of unspent carryforward funds to balance the AB109 Budget. The FY2022/23 Requested Budget for AB109 does not rely on the use of unspent carryforward from prior years. The combination of cost containment and increased revenue in the State Allocation has stabilized and even increased the AB109 carryforward funds. As communicated in prior years, the goal is to maintain AB109 program costs in-line with the annual State funding levels. In the Midyear projections for FY2021/22, departments also achieved this goal. However, as salary costs and inflation effect budgets it will be important for Departments to continually monitor AB109 costs and State allocations and assess the ongoing impacts to carryforward funds.

The Carryforward, which has a projected total of \$8.2 million, based on Midyear projections, at the end of FY2021/22 will be utilized to address future cost increases within Solano County Department AB109 Budgets, and any potential reductions in AB109 allocations from the state during FY2022/23. A comprehensive analysis of the carryforward funds, along with a recommendation for a reserve and future funding opportunities will be looked at and brought back during FY2022/23.

By approval of the recommendations herein, the CCP will be supporting the Requested Budget by the Departments and recommending moving the AB109 budgets forward for the Board of Supervisors approval of \$14.8 million of available FY2022/23 AB109 funding. This appropriation will be included in the operating budgets of the respective Departments to continue to advance concepts in the adopted 2011 Plan.

DISCUSSION:

The FY2022/23 Requested Budget for 2011 Public Safety Realignment is \$14.8 million, which represents an increase of \$950,000 when compared to the FY2021/22 Adopted Budget. This increase is primarily due to negotiated and approved labor contract wage increases, CaIPERS retirement costs, and changes in health benefit costs and workers compensation rates. The following are summaries of the programs and services included in FY2022/23 Requested Budgets for the respective Departments. The funding totals represent the costs to deliver 2011 Public Safety Realignment program services previously recommended by the CCP in accordance with the 2011 Plan.

District Attorney

The 2011 Public Safety Realignment (AB109) imposed legal responsibilities on prosecutor's offices, including the prosecution of revocations of Post-Release Community Supervision (PRCS). For FY2022/23, the District Attorney (DA) has requested \$901,268 of AB109 funding to continue staffing positions and funding costs to address prosecuting duties under AB109.

Public Defender

The 2011 Public Safety Realignment (AB109) also imposed legal responsibilities on the Public Defender's office, including the representation of revocations of Post-Release Community Supervision (PRCS) and parole violations. For FY2022/23, the Public Defender (PD) has requested \$779,399 of AB109 funding which includes the addition of a Social Services Worker to be funded 75% with AB109 funding and to continue staffing positions and funding costs to continue providing legal defense under AB109.

Alternate Public Defender

The 2011 Public Safety Realignment (AB109) imposed legal responsibilities on the Alternate Public Defender's office, including the representation of revocations of PRCS. For FY2022/23, the Alternate Public Defender has requested \$51,836 of AB109 funding to continue staffing positions and funding costs to support AB109.

Sheriff's Office

For FY2022/23 the Sheriff's Office has requested \$6,026,080 of AB109 funding. In addition to personnel costs, the Sheriff is requesting a continuation of offsetting Realignment Funds to cover AB109 inmate related costs, such as inmate meals, medical treatment, and other detention facility costs related to the AB109 inmate population, which typically accounts for over 20% of the County Jail population.

Probation Department

To meet the mandates under the 2011 Public Safety Realignment (AB109) for FY2022/23, Probation is proposing to continue the same level of staffing and programs for 2 re-entry centers and supervision of PRCS and 1170h split sentences. This ongoing effort is estimated to be \$6,616,558 of AB109 funding. To address its 2011 Realignment requirements the Probation Department maintains staffing in order to manage the caseloads of PRCS and to operate the Centers for Positive Change (CPC) in both Vallejo and Fairfield, which includes providing Substance Abuse services and Mental Health Clinician services.

Health & Social Services

To meet its FY2022/23 mandates under the 2011 Public Safety Realignment (AB109), Health & Social Services (H&SS) has requested \$217,801 of AB109 funding to continue staffing positions and funding costs for Mental Health treatment and programs.

Planning and Administration

In meeting mandates under 2011 Public Safety Realignment (AB109) the FY2022/23 Requested Budget includes \$200,640 of AB109 funding to cover expenditures for planning and administration. This request includes partial funding for the Superior Court of California County of Solano Limited Term Collaborative Court Manager (CCM) and 1/3 of the annual cost of the Veterans Court Case Manager. Additionally, the preliminary budget includes funds for data analysis and research and planning services.

Future Plans and Opportunities

A comprehensive analysis of the carryforward funds, along with a recommendation for a reserve and future funding opportunities will be looked at and brought back during FY2022/23.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. The CCP could choose not to receive an update on the 2011 Public Safety Realignment Budget. This is not recommended as it would limit the CCP's ability to make informed decisions regarding the FY2022/23 Requested Budget.
- 2. The CCP could choose not to support a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors on programs and services that total \$14.8 million for FY2022/23 utilizing AB109 funding, to continue to advance concepts in the 2011 Plan. This is not recommended as the CCP has previously adopted the 2011 Plan and not supporting the appropriation of the available funding would limit the County's ability to fully implement the 2011 Plan.

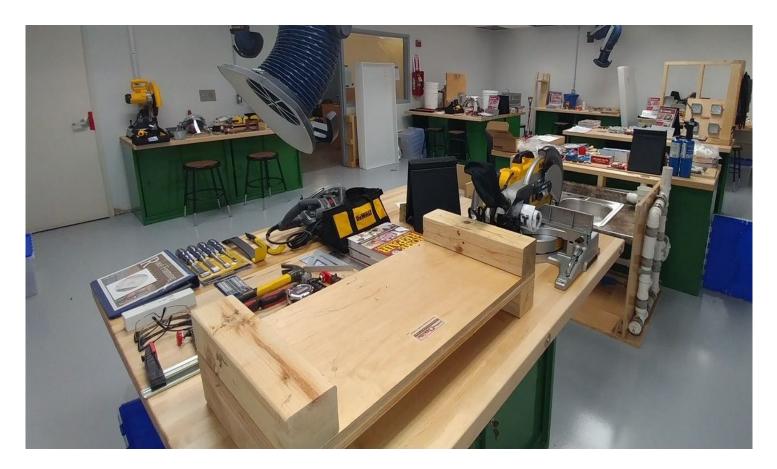
