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SOLANO COUNTY 2013 STATE LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM

PRIORITY ISSUES

The ability of the County to serve the residents of County (County) and provide for a thriving and sustainable community requires support from all levels of government. The State of California's (State) actions and ongoing fiscal crisis continues to threaten the County's ability to provide vital services to the public. In order to fulfill the County's commitment to the community, State resources should be sought to support the County's mission to enrich the quality of life in the County. To this end, the County Board of Supervisors supports the priorities and the legislative principles set forth below.

Priority issues are those that have a significant impact on County business and on which County staff, including the County's State legislative advocates, will concentrate their legislative efforts during the 2013 Legislative Session. The County's top priorities (Listed Alphabetically) include:

- County Revenue Sources Oppose efforts to decrease, restrict, eliminate, seize, divert, supplant or
 otherwise restrict local autonomy of local revenues. Oppose any efforts at the state level to retain
 additional revenues currently dedicated to local government for state purposes. Advocate for
 timely, full state funding for state programs operated by the County, which include appropriate cost
 of living increases, as well as costs associated with increases in population and caseload growth.
- 2. <u>County Strategic Plan</u> Support efforts that further the goals outlined in the County's Strategic Plan as follows: (a) improve the health and well-being of those who live and work here; (b) ensure responsible and sustainable land use; (c) maintain a safe community; and (d) invest in and for the future.
- 3. <u>Healthcare Reform</u> Support healthcare reform that does not financially impact the County in a negative way. Examples of impacts may include unfunded or under-funded mandates, or reallocation of existing County funding that result in an increased General Fund obligation.
- 4. <u>Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta</u> Support legislative and administrative efforts to protect the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and County's interests relative to land use, agricultural stability, economic development, police or emergency response mandates, environmental preservation, flood protection, levee stability, habitat conservation, recreation, water supply, water quality, and water rights. Support governance structures that give local government an equal voice with other stakeholders in setting Delta policy.
- 5. State Realignment & Cost-Shifts Oppose proposals to restructure, realign, or otherwise shift the cost of state programs to local government, without commensurate compensation and a legislative ability for counties to draw down available federal funding. Support efforts to constitutionally guarantee continued funding for realigned programs. Support efforts to improve the stability of current County revenue sources. Oppose any realignment initiatives, which fail to fully fund services shifted to the County.
- 6. <u>Design-Build</u> Support or seek alternative legislation to extend existing provisions to allow design-build bidding options on construction projects.

Furthermore, the Solano Board of Supervisors adopts the following legislative principles (Listed by Policy Area Alphabetically):

Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Water

- Encourage and seek legislation that protects the County's quality of life, its diverse natural resources, and preserves the essence and history of the County.
- Support efforts to maintain, enhance or more fully fund the regulatory authority of the Agricultural Commissioner/ Sealer of Weights and Measures. Support renewal and possible increases in annual fees that may be charged by County Weights and Measures for registering weighing and measuring devices for use within the County.
- Support legislation or administrative rulemaking to allow growers to take feral hogs without a
 depredation permit or hunting license when the hogs are damaging crops or agricultural
 infrastructure.
- Support legislation to collect a statewide cost share from the livestock industry to support USDA Wildlife Services in California counties. Support funding for an alternate intake to the North Bay Aqueduct;
- Oppose bills that allow for industry self-certification of weighing and measuring devices.
- Support legislation that would authorize the Environmental Protection Agency to provide funding to state and local agencies for projects aimed at advancing the goals and objectives of the comprehensive conservation and management plan for the San Francisco estuary.

General Government

- Support fiscal reform efforts that assure the County the financial independence necessary to provide services to its residents and meet its mandated responsibilities.
- Support legislation that provides tax and funding formulas for the equitable distribution of state funds while opposing attempts to decrease, restrict, or eliminate County revenue sources.
- Support increased appropriations to the County for mandated programs, including capital acquisition costs and regulatory relief to save on costs.
- Seek out, develop, and support legislative and budget efforts that protect and/or enhance local governments' revenues, maximize the County's access to state funding sources, and/or increases local funding flexibility.
- Support the enactment of legislation to allocate statewide bond funding based on objective criteria developed with local input.
- Support legislative action to ensure the ongoing recognition of PACE bonds as assessments and support the innovative County Energy Independence Program.
- Support legislation that will allow the County to ensure full cost recovery for services provided to other governmental entities.
- Support legislation that encourages mutually respectful relationships between tribal and local
 governments including reform to both fee-to-trust process and off-reservation gaming provisions to
 insure that the impacts of tribal development are fully mitigated and jurisdictional issues resolved.
- Oppose attempts to restrict local authority with respect to issues that affect local communities.
 Support the County's authority to assure mutually acceptable tax sharing agreements for annexation, incorporation, and redevelopment that protect or enhance the County's ability to provide services to its residents.
- Oppose legislative or administrative actions that would create state unfunded mandates and/or preempt local decision-making authority.
- Oppose any effort to balance the state budget through the taking of local government resources.

Health and Human Services

- Oppose efforts to eliminate, seize, divert, supplant or otherwise restrict local autonomy of local revenues.
- Advocate for changes relative to the client intake process to improve system performance and outcomes.
- Support efforts to support and provide increased funding for prevention, intervention, and treatment services for youth and adults with substance abuse issues.
- California Work Opportunity & Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKS). Oppose efforts to eliminate
 funding for CalWORKS programs and support services. Support efforts to streamline program
 requirements for counties. Support legislation to align CalWORKS regulations for single parents with
 children under 6 to match federal requirements. Support legislation to allow drug felons to access
 CalWORKS grants to stabilize families and assist with funding and obtaining needed mental health
 and substance abuse services.
- Support legislation and budget action which would protect and enhance funding for subsidized child care services, which in turn provides employment and education opportunities for residents of County.
- Support legislation that promotes and funds services to meet the needs of current and former foster
 children, their families, and caregivers. Eliminate civil penalties for foster care homes since the
 children are removed until corrective action is taken and this policy could be a detriment to
 recruiting and retaining foster homes.
- Support legislation and budget action that would protect and enhance funding for subsidized child
 care services and child development programs including school readiness, which in turn provides
 employment and education opportunities for residents of County.
- Support sufficient funding to meeting needs of all the children in our care until they are ready for independence.
- Support efforts that assist foster youth in the transition to self-sufficiency, including post
 emancipation assistance such as secondary education, job training and employment, access to
 health care and other social services and transitional and permanent housing.
- Support eliminating the cutoff of funding for individuals that are eligible but are categorically
 defunded and the cost of medical care for these inmates defaults to the County upon arrest and
 detention of these individuals.
- Support efforts that allow for maximum flexibility in funding decisions for counties to meet the
 needs of their community and mental health consumers and decrease regulatory mandates that
 hinder the ability of local mental health agencies from providing effective services. Support efforts
 to allow for flexibility for all appropriately licensed individuals to bill for provided mental health
 services.
- Support prevention and public health goals including surveillance and community health.
- Support legislative efforts to increase awareness and promote public health issues within the County. Support enhanced training to handle pandemic disease outbreaks. Support efforts to allow for flexibility for all appropriately licensed individuals to bill for provided health services.
- Support legislation to add e-cigarettes, menthol and smokeless tobacco products containing nicotine to the list of tobacco related products to be regulated by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.
- Support legislative and budgetary efforts to improve protections and services to prevent physical, mental, and financial elder abuse and neglect. Support efforts to improve and promote safety for seniors.
- Support continued and protected funding for independent living services for foster youth including housing and educational support.

Health and Human Services - Continued

- Support legislation that promotes prevention–focused policies and interventions.
- Advocate for timely, full state funding for state programs operated by the County that include appropriate cost of living increases, as well as costs associated with increases in population and caseload growth.
- Support legislation that allows for increased remedies for the purpose of Child Support enforcement.
- Support any budget, legislative, or administrative action to increase funding for Local Child Support Agencies.

Housing, Community and Economic Development, and Workforce Investment

- Support Housing Element reform that provides for self-certification process for jurisdictions that have small housing allocation.
- Encourage and seek legislation to facilitate orderly economic expansion and growth, and increase the opportunity for discretionary revenues, programmatic and financial flexibility for the County.
- Support funding and incentives for smart growth and sustainable development.
- Support and strengthen the federal/State/local delivery system for workforce development programs by assuring that State-level initiatives complement local delivery efforts that add value for these business-led efforts.

Public Safety and Emergency Disaster Preparedness

- Support continued and protected funding for all 2011 Public Safety Realignment programs, including Post-Release Community Supervision (PRCS), Youthful Offender Block Grant (YOBG), and Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA).
- Support continued and protected funding for adult probation services. Support efforts for the
 provision of additional resources to reduce criminal recidivism and increase the supervision and
 management of felony offenders on probation.
- Support legislation to provide state offset to recover outstanding restitution ordered to the victims
 of crimes and other delinquent court ordered fines, penalty assessments, and fees associated with
 criminal or juvenile justice proceedings. Support new legislation that would increase the collection
 term from 3 years to between 10 and 20 years, thereby avoiding having to seek civil judgments
 against clients.
- Support legislation and grants that provide increased funding for prevention, intervention, victim support and services for families experiencing domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, dating violence, stalking, elder abuse and human trafficking.

Resource Management, Environmental Health, and Sustainability

- Support legislation and administrative action that further the goals of the County's climate protection efforts.
- Support legislative efforts to keep State Parks open in County.
- Advocate resolution of the "no fish stocking" ruling by Fish & Game at Lake Solano Park.
- Closely monitor updates to Stormwater rules that may have adverse effects on local communities.
- Minimize proposed changes to Building Codes made by the legislative process. Focus code changes on established procedures through the Building Standards Commission.
- Support the appeal of the \$150 per building fee applicable to rural State Responsibility areas. Strive for repeal or return of some of fee revenues to local fire districts.

Resource Management, Environmental Health, and Sustainability - Continued

- Oppose CalEMA's proposals to require local jurisdictions to purchase repetitive loss properties.
- Support efforts to reinstate the state subvention for the Williamson Act program, which was eliminated in FY2011/12.
- Support sensible CEQA reform that streamlines processes for broader range of infill development
 while maintaining strong analytic and mitigation requirements for large projects that clearly have
 significant environmental consequences at a regional or statewide level.
- Support any budget, legislative, or administrative action that improves environmental health regulatory program implementation that improves the County's ability to provide a responsive, efficient, and effective County environmental Health program.
- Support administrative actions by the State Water Resources Control Board to certify County as a Local Oversight Agency for underground fuel tank cleanup once an application is submitted.
- Support legislation that modifies existing law to improve implementation of environmental health regulatory programs and that is supported by the California Conference of Directors of Environmental Health.
- Support legislation and grants that provide funding for implementation of environmental health programs such as food protection, recreational health, solid waste, liquid waste, water supply and hazardous materials programs.
- Support any legislation that reduces or simplifies reporting requirements for local environmental health programs to the state.
- Support any state budget, legislation, or administrative action that increases funding to the California Department of Public Health for implementing requirements of existing law and will result in improved local implementation of environmental health programs, such as the retail food program.
- Support regulatory processes that are not a one-size-fits-all approach and maintain flexibility for the County to determine the best means of achieving water conservation mandates.
- Seek to reverse the current diversion of the Off Highway Vehicle funding so that it returns to local agencies.

Transportation

- Support legislation and budget action which provides additional and continuing funding for local infrastructure, including local roads, bridges, and transit priorities.
- Ensure that existing transportation funding sources are retained.
- Seek to reverse the current diversion of the Off highway vehicle funding so that it returns to local source.
- Seek funding from the Cap and Trade measure to pay for green road maintenance and other enhancements to the transportation network that reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Support or sponsor legislation that provides for the imposition, extension, or increase of a special
 tax for the purpose of providing funding for local transportation projects and lowers the threshold
 for voter approval to 55%.

Veterans and Veterans Affairs

- Support efforts that provide enhanced benefits for veterans and active duty, reserve and National Guard members that are cost-neutral to counties, including expanded mental health services.
- Support legislative, regulatory or policy changes that would create a federal/state/local government partnership to reduce the VA veteran's claims backlog and expand outreach services to veterans.

Veterans and Veterans Affairs - Continued

- Support state legislation to permit the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to collect data on incarcerated veterans and to give that data to the Department of Veterans Affairs (CDVA) for purposes of connecting those incarcerated veterans and their families with the benefits they are still entitled to while incarcerated, as well as assist the veteran upon release from incarceration.
- Support legislation that would make it a criminal offense to intentionally misdirect or mislead a veteran, or anyone acting on the veterans behalf, concerning benefits or entitlements.
- Support legislation that would establish priority enrollment and registration for veterans in community colleges, state colleges, and universities.

Other Agency Interests

- Travis Community Consortium Support the mission of all military organizations located within the County. Support the 2013 state legislative priorities adopted by the Travis Community Consortium. Furthermore, encourage the State to adopt proactive measures regarding the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) and convene an office at the State level to work with each community that has a military installation or defense contractors to protect California's interest with the decline in defense spending and the probable realignment of missions and closure of bases.
- <u>Solano Transportation Authority</u> Support the 2013 legislative state priorities and programs as outlined and adopted by the Solano Transportation Authority.
