## R-8 / SPONTANEOUS PNEUMOTHORAX

## **PRIORITIES**

- ➤ ABCs
- > Determine degree of physiologic distress
- Evaluate respiratory rate, use of accessory muscles, cyanosis, ventilatory effort, level of consciousness
- Maintain airway, provide oxygen and ventilatory support PRN
- Early transport/ Hospital notification (after initiating therapy, if appropriate)
- Code 3 transport for patients in severe respiratory distress
- > EARLY CONTACT OF RECEIVING HOSPITAL.

- > Stabilize airway;
- **OXYGEN** High Flow.
- Cardiac monitor
- Begin transport;
- > Consider IV access;
- Continuously monitor for signs of tension pneumothorax; If they develop tension Pneumothorax; **CONTACT BASE PHYSICIAN** for **ORDER** to do **NEEDLE THORACOSTOMY** on affected side (Per Protocol S-1).

## DISRUPTED COMMUNICATIONS

In the event that a Solano County EMT-P is UNABLE to make physician contact for orders, the paramedic MAY NOT utilize those areas of the protocol needing physician direction and MUST TRANSPORT IMMEDIATELY TO THE CLOSEST FACILITY.
