SENATE BILL 139: INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING

SB 139 would require counties with 400,000 residents to create independent redistricting commissions to draw supervisor boundaries. This would be instead of the Supervisors themselves drawing the boundaries, as is the current practice. I testified in support of SB 139 when it was in committee. SB 139 has passed the legislature and is awaiting Gov. Newsom's signature. I sent the Gov. a letter asking him to sign SB 139.
