HOME KITCHEN ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

On Tuesday December 10, the Board will be considering the Home Kitchen Enterprise program. I requested this item be brought to the Board and the Board voted 4-1 to move forward. Essentially, this program will allow persons to sell meals prepared in their homes if they only sell 30 meals a day with a cap of 60 meals a week and \$50,000 in gross sales. To be eligible, interested persons would need to register with the county and obtain a food safety certification.

I consider this program to be an important economic tool for our residents and our military spouses. Those unable to start a full restaurant can use this program to get their feet in the door and work their way toward opening a full restaurant. Military spouses have a difficult time finding employment because of having to move frequently as the military reassigns the family. This is an excellent way to provide income to military spouses.

I would encourage everyone to be at the Board meeting at 675 Texas St in Fairfield on Dec 10th at 9 AM to support this program.

HELP WITH PURCHASING HEALTH INSURANCE

Starting in 2020, California law will require individuals to have health insurance. If you do not have health insurance, you may face a fine. In the most recent state budget, more money was allocated to help CA residents purchase health insurance than in years in past. PORT CHICAGO MEMORIAL

On Saturday November 9th, a plaque was unveiled in Vallejo on Ryder street at the site of the Port Chicago Mutiny. At Port Chicago in Concord, an explosion killed over 300 sailors, over 200 of whom were African-American. The explosion took place on July 17, 1944.

African-American sailors stationed at the barracks in Vallejo were asked to load munitions in dangerous conditions like the conditions that caused the explosion at Port Chicago. What became known as the Port Chicago Mutiny took place on Ryder St in Vallejo when African-American sailors refused to load munitions in unsafe conditions. Fifty of the sailors were ultimately convicted. Legislation is pending in Congress to exonerate the sailors convicted.

I presented a resolution from the county recognizing the event. It was such a heart breaking and yet inspiring event. The bravery of the sailors, the injustices they faced and the need to learn from our history were all on my mind at this event.

I am so thankful to Vallejo residents Sharon McGriff-Payne, Brien Farrell, Jim Kern, Liat Meitzenheimer, and Brendan Riley for their work on the memorial.

VETERAN'S DAY

On Monday Nov 11th, I participated in Veteran's day events in Benicia and Vallejo in the morning. I was in Benicia for the raising of the flags and I was at the Mare Island Cemetery for the Veteran's day remembrances.

In the afternoon, I participated in the Fairfield Veteran's Day Parade. I was able to ride in a WWII jeep in the parade.

NAMING THE WATERFRONT PARK AFTER BARBARA KONDYLIS

I was so happy to see the Vallejo City Council vote to name the waterfront park after former Supervisor Barbara Kondylis. The Council did this at the Nov. 12th meeting.
