HOME KITCHEN ENTERPRISES

On Tuesday December 10th, the Board of Supervisors approved my proposal to allow Home Kitchen Enterprises in Solano County. Staff will bring back the final resolution for the Board's approval. Essentially, this will allow persons to sell homemade food from their home. They will be limited to \$50,000 a year, 30 meals a day and 60 meals a week. They will have to be inspected, obtain a permit from the county and be certified in food safety.

Supervisors Spering and Thomson supported me in bringing Home Kitchens to Solano County. I view this as an opportunity for our residents. This will be an opportunity for our military spouses from Travis Air Force Base. Military spouses, because of moving frequently, have a hard time obtaining careers. The Home Kitchen program is an excellent way for military spouses to have an economic opportunity.

The Small Business Development Center, the Cook's Alliance, several advocates for Travis spouses and Vallejo resident LaDonna Williams all helped in getting the Home Kitchens approved. I look forward to seeing how this can benefit Solano County.
