As we slowly and safely reopen businesses and services in alignment with state guidance, the community is reminded to stay diligent in maintaining 6-foot physical distancing between others, washing hands frequently, practicing cough etiquette, and wearing cloth face coverings to curb the spread of coronavirus.

As of June 19, 2020, Solano County has 811 total confirmed cases reported, with 98 total hospitalizations, 147 active cases, 13 current hospitalizations, and 23 deaths. At present, The ICU and ventilator capacity are in the 'good' range.

We are continuing to respond to the COVID-19 situation, by investigating outbreaks, tracing contacts and monitoring the number of cases and hospital capacity, to protect the health of Solano County residents. We will follow State guidance on reopening additional sectors, and will move forward on reopening them in our County based on local conditions.

Solano County continues to monitor COVID-19 clusters

Solano County has seen an increase in the number of confirmed cases this week. The two main contributing factors are (1) the significant delay in receiving final confirmation of positive COVID-19 cases and (2) a confirmed outbreak of vineyard workers housed in Solano County and working in other counties. Social gatherings and a lack of social distancing have been linked to a significant amount of the positive cases and public health officials urges residents to maintain social distancing and limit social gatherings.

Reopening Solano County Safely

Personal care services and professional sports can reopen with modifications

Solano Public Health has amended the County's stay at home order and directive, allowing additional services to resume as long as they meet the guidance criteria. The services include:

- Personal care services, including but not limited to:
 - Facials
 - Electrolysis
 - Waxing
 - Skin care
 - Cosmetology
 - Electrology
 - Nail salons
 - Massage therapy
 - Body art professionals such as tattoo parlors and piercing shops
- Professional sports without live audiences

Businesses are required to meet specific COVID-19 guidelines, including establishing a workplace specific plan, training employees, implementing screening and infection control measures, cleaning and disinfecting protocols and guidelines for social distancing best practices. State officials release guidance requiring Californians to wear a face covering

Californians must wear face coverings in most setting outside the home. Scientific research has shown that people with no or few symptoms of COVID-19 can still spread the disease and that the use of face coverings, combined with physical distancing and frequent hand washing, will reduce the spread of COVID-19.
