Information this week

PG&E bills could increase for some customers with new law

The three major power companies in California, which includes PG&E, have proposed a new law that would change monthly power bills. Under this law, what customers pay would be based on household income, which individual households would need to report to PG&E. The law would add a fixed monthly charge based on income in addition to electricity charge, which will fluctuate based on use but will be reduced. This may mean that lower-income households pay less for electricity while higher-income households would pay more. To read more about this proposed law, read this article.

Highway 37 to become a toll road

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) has proposed a rebuilding and widening of Highway 37. This would require making the highway a toll road. The project aims to begin construction in 2025 and finish in 2027; no tolls would be charged until the project is complete. Updates from around Solano County Benicia water line update



Last week, the temporary bypass line to provide water to Benicia began testing. This week, the first phase of testing has been successful and the structural integrity of the bypass line is sound. Testing will continue into next month when staff will try to expand the line to increase water flow.

Solano Ag Pass - don't miss your chance to apply

This programs helps to better prepare commercial farmers, ranchers, ag processors, and horse stable operators in the event of natural disasters and pre-approves entrance to evacuation areas in emergencies.
