

NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF A DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (EIR) AND ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT (EA) FOR THE STATE ROUTE (SR) 37 FLOOD REDUCTION PROJECT (STATE CLEARINGHOUSE NO. 2021110045)



WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (Calitrans) proposes to reduce flooding from stormwater overtopping and adapt to the projected 2130 sea level rise on SR 37 from Post Mile (PM) R11.2 to 13.8, in Marin County, California. The Project would replace the Novato Creek Bridge and construct a causeway at an elevation of 35 feet in 2 phases. The causeway would extend from U.S. 101 to Atherton Avenue.

Caltrans, as the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act and the National Environmental Policy Act, announced that the Draft Environmental Impact Report and Environmental Assessment for the proposed State Route (SR) 37 Flood Reduction Project is available for public review and comment. The document is available through this link.

The proposed Project would be constructed in two phases.

• Phase 1: Caltrans would replace the Novato Creek bridge with a longer structure at the elevation of 35 feet, install two temporary transition bridge structures tied into existing grades, improve two existing local access roads, replace culverts, and regrade an existing drainage channel. Construction is anticipated to commence in 2027.

• Phase 2: Caltrans would construct the rest of the causeway from the 101/37 intersection to Atherton Avenue Undercrossing to an elevation of 35 feet. Caltrans proposes to remove the existing Simonds Slough Bridge, reconstruct the on and offramps at Hanna Ranch Road, Marsh Drive, and Atherton Avenue, install Type 85 barriers, and replace two culverts. Construction is anticipated to commence in 2041, subject to funding availability.

In this meeting, Caltrans will provide an overview of the Project and its purpose and need, the current build alternative, and the potential environmental impacts of the Project.

-Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound!

-A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall and at least 10 feet from the stove.

-People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms that have strobe lights and bed shakers.

The public review draft of the City of Vallejo Housing Element is being released up to October 24 in order for the public to review and provide comments, before it is sent to the California State Department of Housing and Community Development Department for its initial review.

The Planning Commission, the Housing and Community Development Commission and the City Council will also each hold public meetings to consider this document. The purpose of each public meeting will be to provide an overview of the public

review draft of the Housing Element, provide an outline for the review process itself, and to ensure that the public will have an opportunity to provide verbal comments on document. No action will be taken at any of these meetings.



Each of these meetings are held at City Hall, 555 Santa Clara Street, Vallejo, California. Members of the Public will be able to participate inperson or remotely via Zoom.

A Housing Element is a state required element of a City's General Plan. The Housing Element must be updated every eight years and includes goals, objectives, policies, and implementation programs that address the maintenance, preservation, improvement, and development of housing in city limits. In addition, the Housing Element Update identifies sites appropriate for the development of multifamily housing. The Housing Element Update also includes other amendments necessary to comply with recent changes in State law. Prior to the submittal of the Draft to the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) for their review and comment, a Draft Housing Element has been prepared and now available for a 47 day public review and comment period. It is longer than the 30 day mandated public review period so that the community members will have the ability to share their comments at the City Council meeting on October 24, 2023.

City of Fairfield seeks applications for Measure P Oversight Committee

The City of Fairfield is accepting applications for two seats on the Measure P Oversight Committee. The unexpired term ends June 30, 2028. Applicants must be Fairfield residents and taxpayers. In November 2012, Fairfield voters passed Measure P, a one-cent transaction and use tax ordinance. In November 2016, Fairfield voters extended it through March 31, 2033. The ordinance directs the City Council to establish a five-member oversight committee to review expenditures of revenues collected pursuant to the ordinance.

Did you know? Solano Mobility offers a multitude of programs for commuters and travelers who live or work in Solano County. Some programs include:

- **Guaranteed Ride** If you ride the Solano Express Blue, Green, Red or Yellow Line to travel to work in Solano County, or to travel from Solano County to your workplace, you can receive an Uber Voucher to use if your Solano Express route is cancelled.
- Amtrak + Lyft If you are a resident or employed in Fairfield, Suisun City, or Vacaville, the Amtrak + Lyft Program provides participants a 10ride Amtrak pass plus 10 free Solano County train station Lyft connections, all for \$20.
- **Guaranteed Ride Home** If you use a commute alternative like transit, carpool, or vanpool to travel to work in Solano County or travel from Solano County to your workplace, you can get reimbursement for your emergency ride home.
- **Bucks for Bikes** Do you ride your bike to work? Are you considering it? Solano Mobility offers an incentive that will reimburse 60% of the cost of a new bicycle for commuting up to \$300.



Updates from around Solano County Fairfield energizes first pilot public EV charging site




The City of Fairfield announce that its first pilot public EV charging site is now open and available for use. The four 50kW DC fast chargers are located in the Allan Witt Sports Complex parking lot and are capable of simultaneous charging.

The City partnered with EVCS to install a total of 31 DC Fast chargers and 27 Level 2 chargers across eight strategic locations: three downtown, two at park-and-rides, and three at community parks. All chargers will be powered by 100 percent renewable energy and will allow commuters the opportunity to fast charge their vehicles throughout Fairfield, gaining about 100 miles of range after only 30

minutes of charging. Six of the eight locations will feature Level 2 chargers designed for longer charging sessions.

These charging stations are the result of an ongoing collaboration between the City, EVCS, the Solano Transportation Authority (STA), and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD).




