PURPOSE STATEMENT – Community Corrections Partnership

The mission of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) is to discuss issues related to the implementation of various pieces of state legislation that focus on adult criminal offenders, including the realignment of many state public safety functions to local jurisdictions. The overall objective is to reduce the recidivism rate of adult offenders in the local criminal justice system.

Membership of the CCP is outlined in California Penal Code section 1230 and defined by the Community Corrections Performance Incentive Act of 2009 (SB 678) and includes the Chief Probation Officer (Chair)*, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court* or his or her designee, a County Supervisor or County Administrator, District Attorney*, Public Defender*, Sheriff*, the head of the Department of Social Services*, the head of the County Department of Mental Health, the head of the County Department of Employment, the head of the County Alcohol and Substance Abuse programs, the County Superintendent of Education, a local chief of police*, a representative of a community-based organization with experience in successfully providing rehabilitative services to persons convicted of criminal offenses, and an individual who represents the interests of victims.

Through AB 109/AB117 the CCP is responsible for recommending a local plan to the county Board of Supervisors (BOS) for the implementation of public safety realignment. This legislation also established an Executive Committee within the CCP. Each Executive Committee member is identified with an asterisk (*) above. The Executive Committee is responsible for approving the local plan for recommendation to the BOS.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) consider utilizing up to \$60,000 in AB109 Planning Fund annual allocation to support the County's participation in funding a feasibility study of a Regional Correctional Mental Health Facility.

SUMMARY:

Several California Counties led by representatives from Sacramento County are working to conduct a feasibility study for a Regional Correctional Mental Health Facility. Sacramento County completed an RFP and selected a consultant to complete this analysis and is reaching out to other counties who may wish to participate in the study and the recommended solutions to address correctional mental health needs. Solano County is one of eleven counties which has been asked to participate in the study, which will consist of two phases.

Phase 1 will consist of an initial analysis of county correctional mental health needs, including an assessment of current services and treatment, recommended treatment models for centralized deliver of mental health services and a cost benefit analysis of a regional treatment model. Additional details on the scope of phase 1 is outlined in the discussion section herein. The estimated total cost of phase 1 of the study is \$603,895 and will be proportionally allocated to each participating county. Solano County's portion of the estimated allocated cost is \$60,000 for phase 1.

The County Administrator is recommending that Solano County utilize a portion of available AB109 Planning Funds received annually to fund the \$60,000 study costs. The CCP is asked to consider supporting this recommendation for use of AB109 planning funds.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The estimated total cost of participation in phase 1 of the Regional Correctional Mental Health Facility study is \$603,895 and will be proportionally allocated to each participating county. Solano County's portion of the estimated allocated cost for participating in the study and related analysis is \$60,000 for phase 1. This cost is proposed to be funded with available Solano County AB109 planning funds.

DISCUSSION:

The participating counties in coordination with the contractor selected in the RFP process, CGL Companies, LLC, proposes the following phase 1 scope for a feasibility study of the development of regional correctional mental health facility for eleven counties in northern California as follows:

Task 1: Assess current services & treatment populations. Document the degree and type of demand for mental health services present in the correctional systems of the participating counties, as well as how the demand for these services will change in the future. Provide a comprehensive assessment of the existing mental health population by jurisdiction and, all health services required for appropriate management in compliance with contemporary professional and legal standards.

Task 2: Develop a treatment model for centralized delivery of mental health services. Identify the types and mix of programs and treatment necessary at the regional facility to meet the needs of the targeted county populations, addressing the multiplicity of service needs in these populations. The clinical delivery plan will address each of the various inpatient, outpatient, treatment programs and therapeutic needs of the projected mental health population for the combined 11 counties.

Task 3: Conduct a cost/benefit analysis of the regional service delivery model. Assess the cost implications of the development and operation of a regional correctional mental health facility, comparing these costs with the projected resource requirements that each county would face in managing its own correctional mental health services program. The analysis will project the total clinical services, custody operations, and support requirements for such a facility, as well as the indirect costs to each county associated with the support of such a facility. Potential cost reductions achieved in each county resulting from the centralization of mental health services will be identified and compared with the costs each county would face in managing a comparable level of program services on their own.

Task 4: Document findings in a Final Report. Upon completion of our analysis, we will develop a draft report which will be submitted to the Project Manager and circulated for review to the Project Stakeholders. The report will summarize all the project team's work and the resulting analysis. Upon completion of their review, we will meet with the Stakeholders to answer questions, address concerns, and make any modifications to the report that may be required.

Upon review of the Final Report, project stakeholders will determine if the project concept is feasible and whether to advance to Phase 2 of the project. This phase would address development of a facility prototype, site selection, and assessment of the alternative approaches such as remodeling an existing facility or development on a new "green field" site.

ALTERNATIVES:

The CCP could choose not to support allocation of up to \$60,000 in AB109 planning funds to support the Solano County participation in the Regional Correctional Mental Health Study. This is not recommended as the CCP is currently funding a portion of the cost for housing and treatment of AB109 offenders in the Solano County correctional facilities who require mental health services and may benefit from regional treatment models evaluated in the study.

AB109 Contract Updates
