PURPOSE STATEMENT – Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council

The mission of the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council is to develop a comprehensive, multiagency plan that identifies the resources and strategies for providing an effective continuum of responses for the prevention, intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of male and female juvenile offenders, including strategies to develop and implement locally based or regionally based out-of-home placement options for youths who are persons described in Section 602w/c. Counties may utilize community punishment plans developed pursuant to grants awarded from funds included in the 1995 Budget Act to the extent the plans address juvenile crime and the juvenile justice system or local action plans previously developed for this program

The membership of the coordinating council is outlined in California Welfare and Institutions Code 749.22 and shall, at a minimum, include the chief probation officer, as chair, and one representative each from the district attorney's office, the public defender's office, the sheriff's department, the board of supervisors, the department of social services, the department of mental health, a community-based drug and alcohol program, a city police department, the county office of education or a school district, and an at-large community representative. In order to carry out its duties pursuant to this section, a coordinating council shall also include representatives from nonprofit community-based organizations providing services to minors.

This agenda shall be made available upon request in alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42U.S.C.sec12132) and the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal.Govt.Code sec.54954.2). Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 9:30am. Chief Hansen welcomed everyone to the meeting and did brief introductions.

Approval of Agenda

Lisette Estrella-Henderson made a motion to approve the agenda. Motion seconded by Michael Wilson. No opposition. Motion carried (8-0).

Approval of Minutes

Linda Connelly made a motion to approve the Minutes. Motion seconded by Elena D'Agustino. No opposition. Motion carried (8-0).

Public Comments

Airto Morales spoke to the Committee regarding the Racial and Ethnic Disparities workgroup and the need for bringing more community partners to the table to discuss the needs of our clients reintegrating into the community and having more previously justice involved mentors that can relate to the clients needs.

RISE Program and Youth Services Center Updates

The Committee received an update on the Reaching Into Successful Endeavors (RISE) program and the Youth Services Center (YSC) to include a brief overview of the CBT programming and intervention services which includes Thinking for a Change (T4C), Reasoning and Rehabilitation (R&R), Aggression Replacement Training (ART): with a youth peer facilitator/mentor, Interactive journaling and Carey Guides. Also noted a few other programs offered to include Gang Intervention, the Culinary Program which had a recent graduation of three youth who received their Food Handlers certificate and ServSafe certificate through Aramark and their IN2WORKS program, the Personal Training Program where two staff and two youth recently received their personal trainer certificate, as well as offering yoga and soundbaths, the Hour of Power and Summer Jam.

Request for Proposal (RFP) for Prevention Services

The Committee received information regarding the scoring of the community grant proposals to provide prevention services to at risk and justice involved youth. The Committee was asked to consider a recommendation to award grant funds to Leaven Kids and Police Athletic League and to delegate authority to the Probation Department to lead the development and execution of RFP contracts.

Lisette Estrella-Henderson made a motion to approve the recommendation. Motion seconded by Leticia De La Cruz. No opposition. No abstention. Motion carried (8-0).

Funding Decision for RFP for Prevention Services

The Committee received information regarding the funding for the Prevention Services community grants. The Committee discussed how to allocate remaining funds not awarded in the initial round of RFP's and decided to have further discussions to give more opportunity for other Community Based Organizations to come forward with proposals. This item will be tabled to the next meeting.

Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Grant Update

The Committee received an update on the JAG grant from the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC). An email will be sent out seeking representatives to serve on the subcommittee. Once the subcommittee has been established, the subcommittee will provide updates to the JJCC at future meetings.

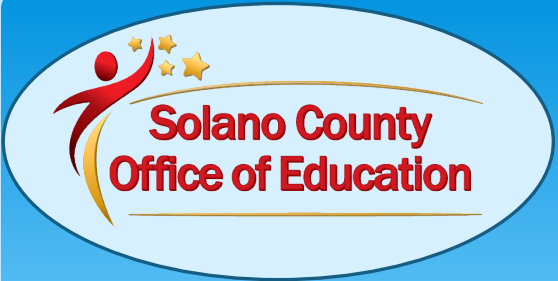

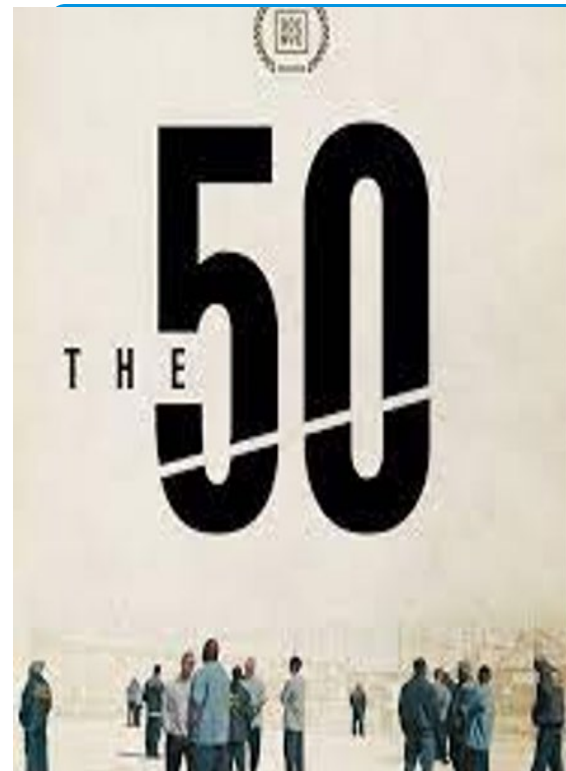
