

# 2022 Statewide General Election Notice of Measures

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the following measures will be submitted to the voters of Solano County at the Statewide General Election to be held on November 8, 2022.

Measure D – City of Dixon – Transaction and Use Tax Measure

"Shall the measure to maintain Dixon's essential services such as fire prevention; rapid 911 emergency response/neighborhood police patrols; disaster preparedness; crime/gangs/drugs prevention; street/pothole repair; attract/retain local businesses/jobs; and for general government use; by establishing a 1¢ sales tax until ended by voters, providing approximately \$3,100,000 annually, with independent citizen oversight and no money that can be taken by the State, be adopted?"

## Measure E – Solano County – Transaction and Use Tax Measure

"To provide general County services, such as enhancing fire protection to reduce wildfire risk, preventing spread of wildfires from wildland areas to residential neighborhoods, improving 9-1-1 response times, adding rural and city firebreaks/reducing flammable vegetation, adding firefighters/paramedics, and improving early wildfire detection shall Solano County's ordinance enacting a 1/8% sales tax until ended by voters be adopted, requiring independent oversight, audits, and all revue controlled locally?"

Measure K – City of Benicia – Extend Duration of Urban Growth Boundary Measure

"To continue the existing protections provided by the current Urban Growth Boundary ("UGB"), such as preventing urban sprawl, and preserving agricultural land and open space, shall the City of Benicia extend the existing UGB until December 31, 2043, clarify the uses permitted beyond the UGB, and require that future changes to the UGB be approved by the voters?

Measure M – Travis Unified School District – Bond Measure

"To repair aging schools by replacing plumbing, electrical, heating, and air conditioning systems; updating/adding classrooms for math, science, English, robotics/technology

instruction; and improving safety and security, shall the Travis Unified School District measure authorizing \$64 million dollars in bonds at legal rates be adopted, levying 6 cents per \$100 dollars of assessed value (\$4 million dollars annually) while bonds are outstanding, with independent citizen oversight, no funds for administrators, and all funds for local schools only?"

### Measure P – City of Vallejo – Transaction and Use Tax Measure

"To maintain critical city services, such as keeping public spaces healthy/safe/clean; maintaining fire protection/emergency medical response/crime prevention; addressing homelessness/blight/dumping; repairing deteriorating neighborhood streets/roads/ sidewalks; and for general government use; shall the City of Vallejo adopt a measure establishing a 0.875% sales tax, providing \$18,000,000 annually until ended by voters, requiring audits, independent citizen oversight, and all funds legally required to be spent locally?"

#### Measure Q - Vacaville Unified School District – Bond Measure

"To improve the quality of education; provide science, technology, engineering, and mathematics labs/classrooms; construct, upgrade, and renovate classrooms, restrooms and school facilities; and repair/replace leaky roofs, shall Vacaville Unified School District's measure be adopted authorizing \$229,500,000 of bonds at legal rates, generating on average \$13,745,000 annually while bonds are outstanding at a rate of approximately 4.5¢ per \$100 assessed value, with annual audits, independent oversight committees, NO money for teacher salaries, and all funds spent locally?"

### Measure R – City of Benicia – Transaction and Use Tax Measure

"Benicia Local Road Repair and Infrastructure Measure. Shall the City of Benicia enact a measure raising local funds under local control for general government purposes, including: repairing, paving and maintaining deteriorating streets; fixing potholes; improving safe routes to schools; protecting local creeks and the bay from toxins and pollution by fixing aging, deteriorating storm drains; by adopting a ¾ cent sales tax, providing approximately \$5,000,000 annually, with citizens' oversight and annual audits, until ended by voters?"

#### Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District – Bond Measure

"To improve the quality of education; make health, safety and handicapped accessibility improvements; repair or replace leaky roofs; and construct/modernize classrooms, restrooms and school facilities; shall Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District's measure be adopted authorizing \$249,600,000 of bonds at legal rates, generating on average \$17,700,000 annually while bonds are outstanding at a rate of approximately 4¢ per \$100 assessed value, with annual audits,

independent citizens' oversight committee, NO money for salaries and no money taken by the State?"

**NOTICE** is given that August 19<sup>th</sup> is the last day to file arguments for or against measures. Arguments are not to exceed 300 words in length. Arguments for or against the measure shall be filed in the Registrar of Voters Office, 675 Texas Street, Suite 2600, Fairfield, CA., no later than 5:00 P.M.

August 23<sup>rd</sup> is the last day to file rebuttal arguments for or against measures. Rebuttal arguments are not to exceed 250 words in length. Rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the Registrar of Voters, no later than 5:00 P.M. The viewing period will commence immediately afterward.

In accordance with section 9600 of the California Elections Code, all arguments and rebuttals filed pursuant to this notice shall be accompanied by a signature statement form to be signed by each author.
