The job description is finished, and it is going to the Civil Service Commission at the end of the month and it's going to the Board of Supervisors in the beginning of November. We will hire one full-time and 4 part-time Peer Specialists. Behavioral Health will post the positions in November.	
	 Behavioral Health has already started the budget process for next year. All psychiatrist positions are filled. We are recruiting for the Medical Director position. We are meeting to talk about Laura's Law on Thursday, November 1, 2018.
