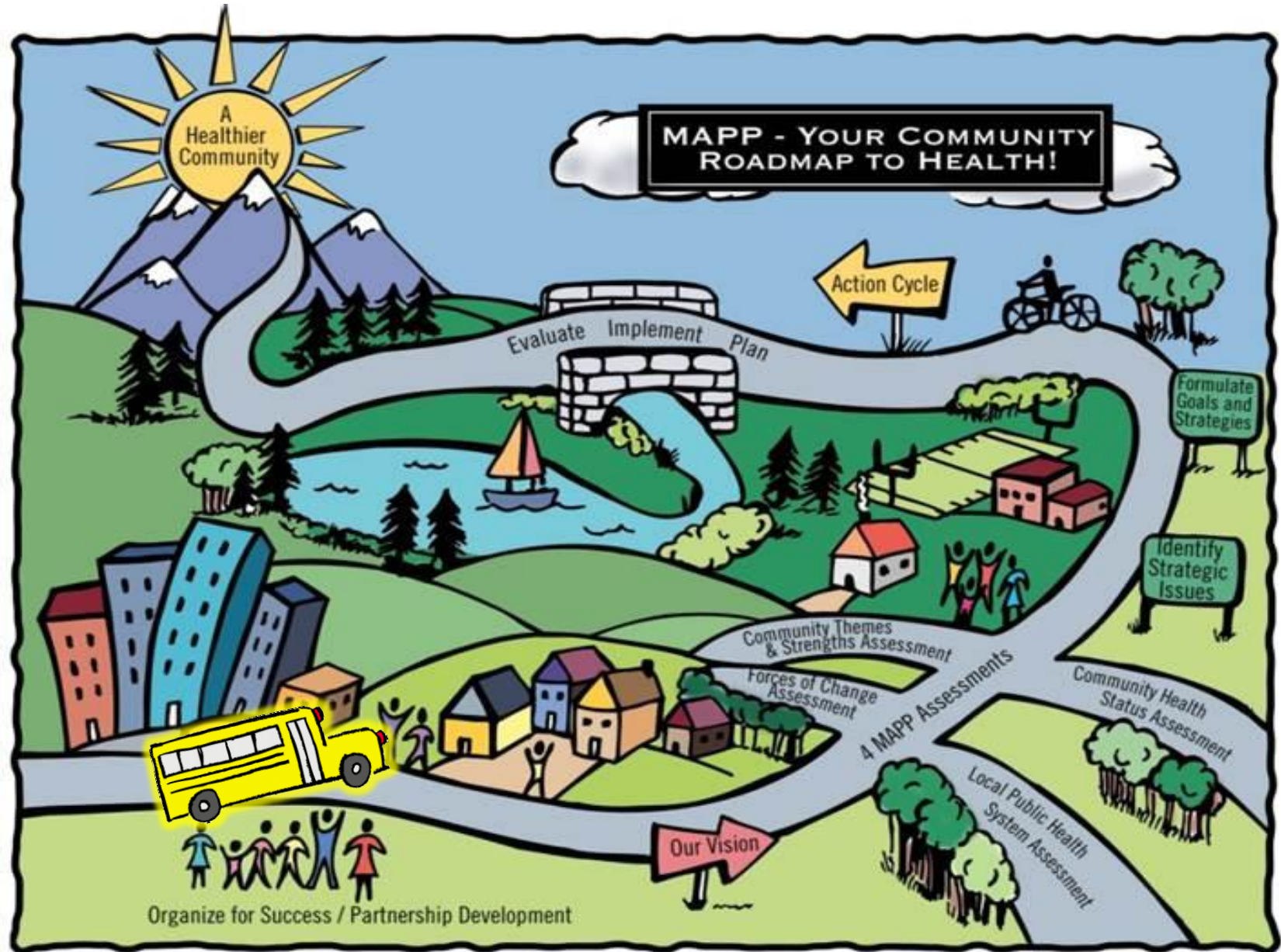

Four MAPP Assessments

1. COMMUNITY HEALTH STATUS ASSESSMENT (CHSA)

CHSA answers questions such as: "How healthy are our residents?" and "What does the health status of our community look like?"

2. COMMUNITY THEMES & STRENGTHS ASSESSMENT (CTSA)


CTSA results in a strong understanding of community issues and concerns, perceptions about quality of life, and a map of community assets.

3. LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH SYSTEM ASSESSMENT (LPHSA)

LPHSA focuses on all of the organizations and entities that contribute to the public's health.

4. FORCES OF CHANGE (FoC)

FoC focuses on identifying forces such as legislation, technology, and other impending changes that affect the context in which the community and its public health system operate.

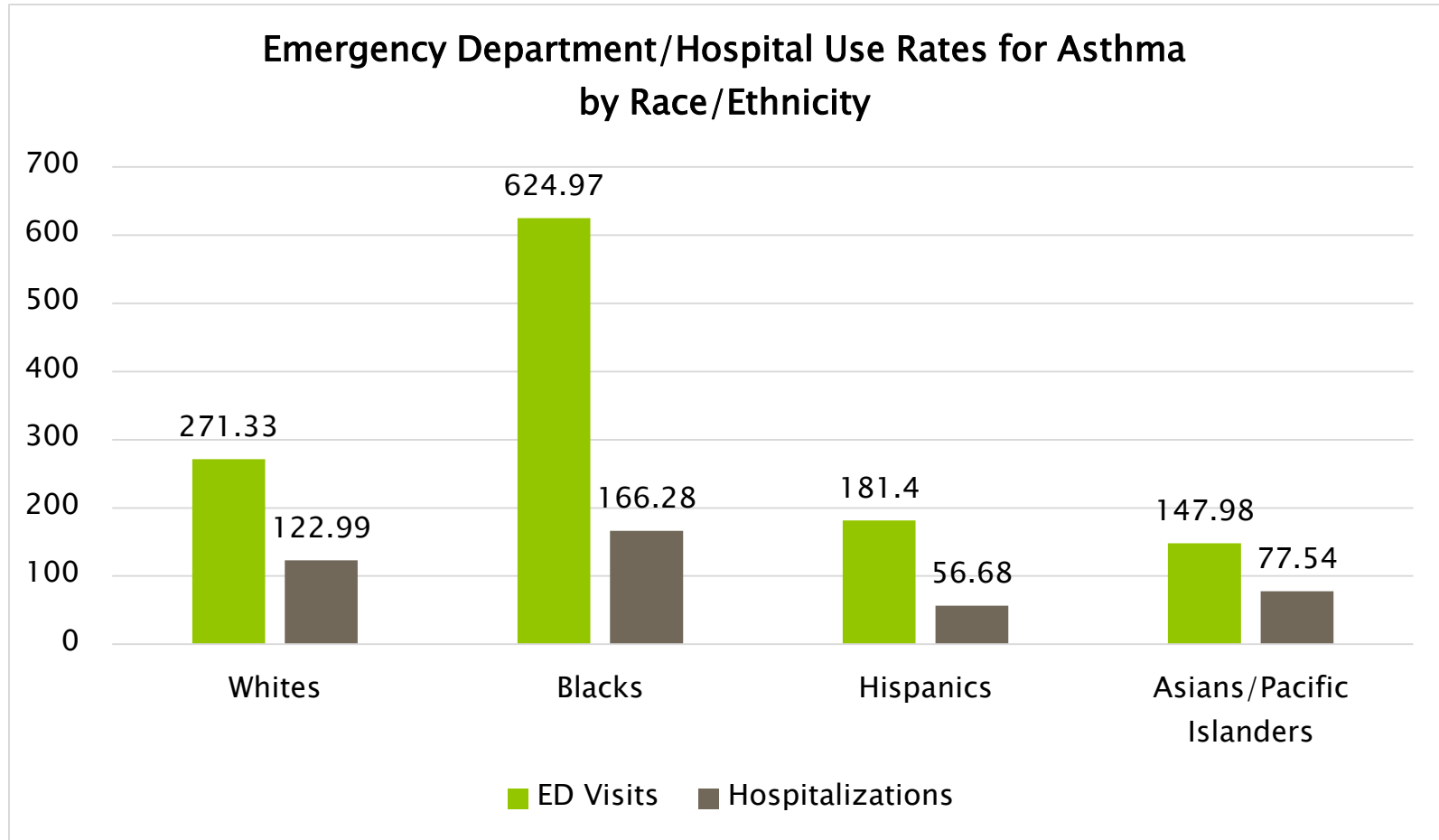

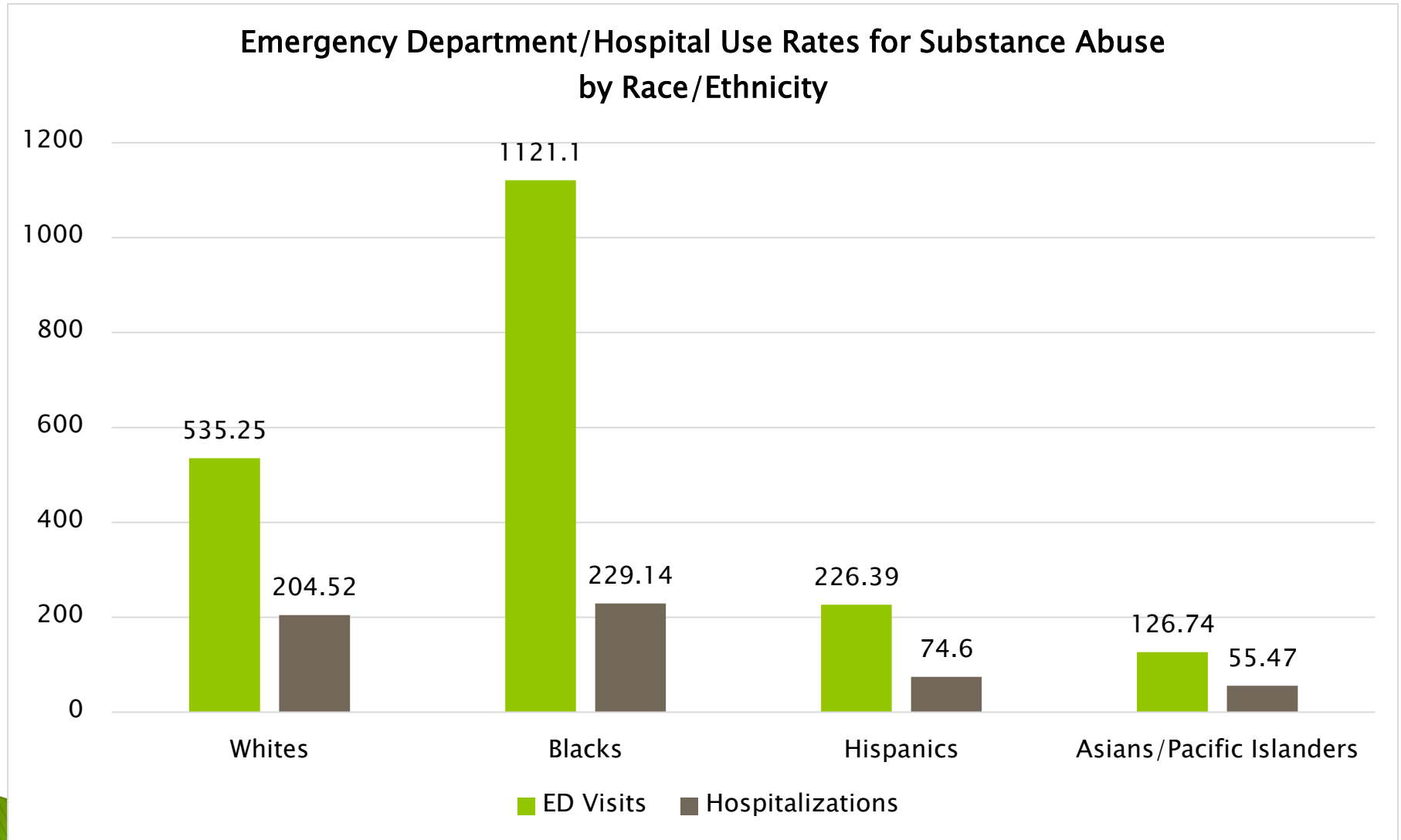

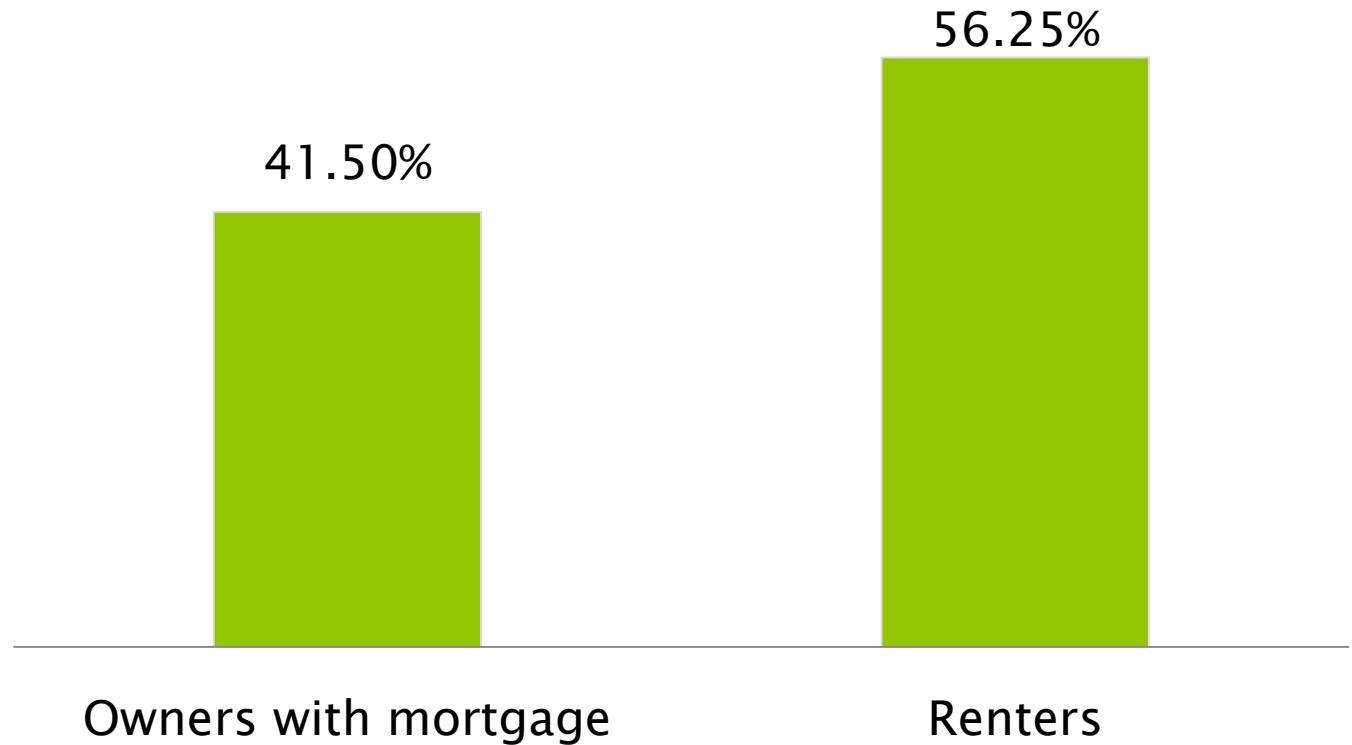
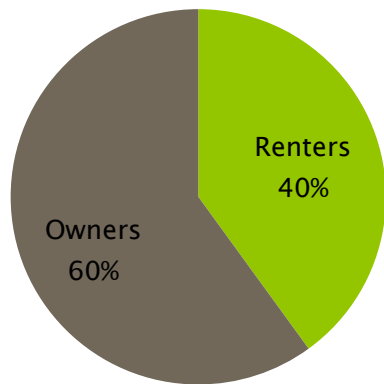
Barriers to using existing transportation infrastructure:

- Cost
- Route unavailability & incoordination
- Traveling with children
- Lack of intercity routes
- Time commitment to use public transit to get to appointments

“Solano County has adequate but not excellent transportation infrastructure. People have a lot of trouble getting, again I am speaking to MediCal beneficiaries not people that own cars, they have trouble getting to their services. They often can’t get there or they are late and then they are excluded from their visits. So there’s that lack of infrastructure for that particular population...”

Monthly **Housing Cost Burden** greater than 30% of household income



"I've been on the waiting list to get affordable housing for 2 years now and I'm still waiting. And I'm basically disabled...I'm still waiting, even though I'm labeled as disabled and I got that extra point up. I'm not the only disabled person who's trying to get that affordable housing and housing is just going up..."

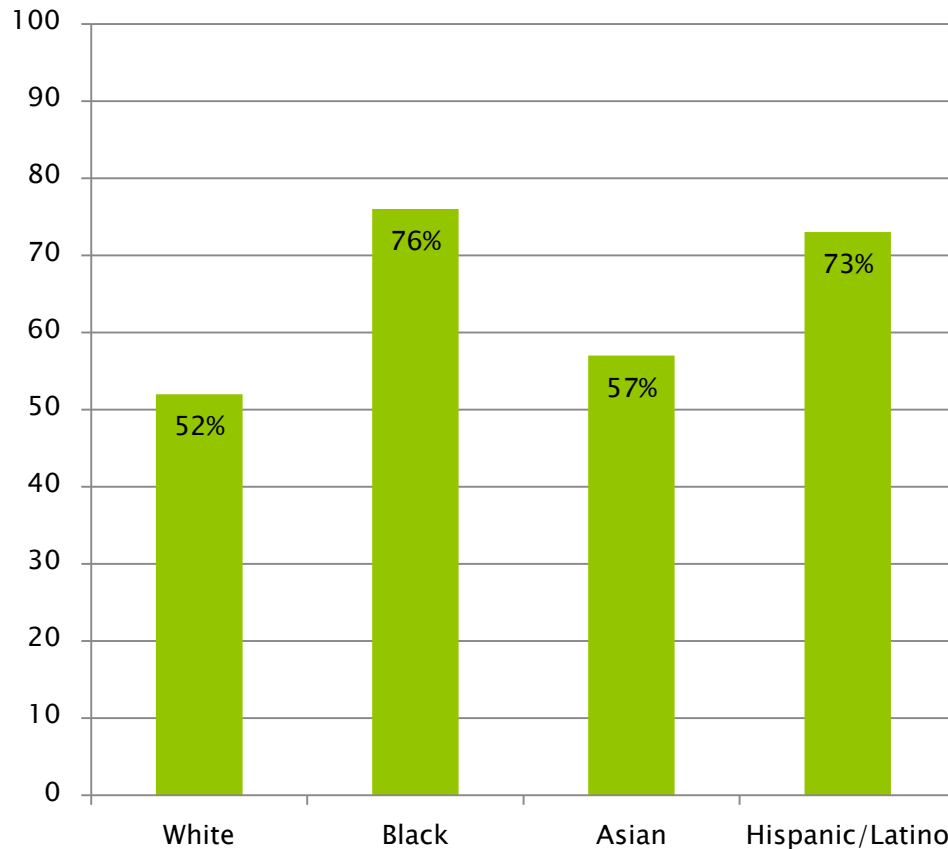

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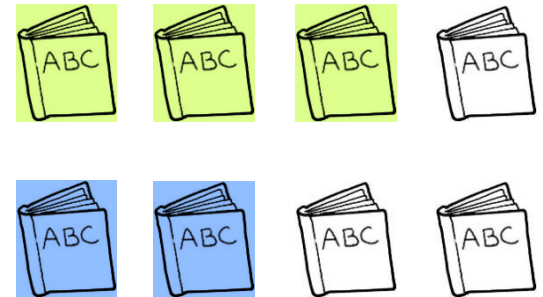

Percent of 3rd Graders not meeting English Language Arts/Literacy State Standards



On average, **3 in 4 Black** Solano County 3rd Graders **do not meet** English Language Arts/Literacy standards, compared to **2 in 4 White** 3rd Graders.

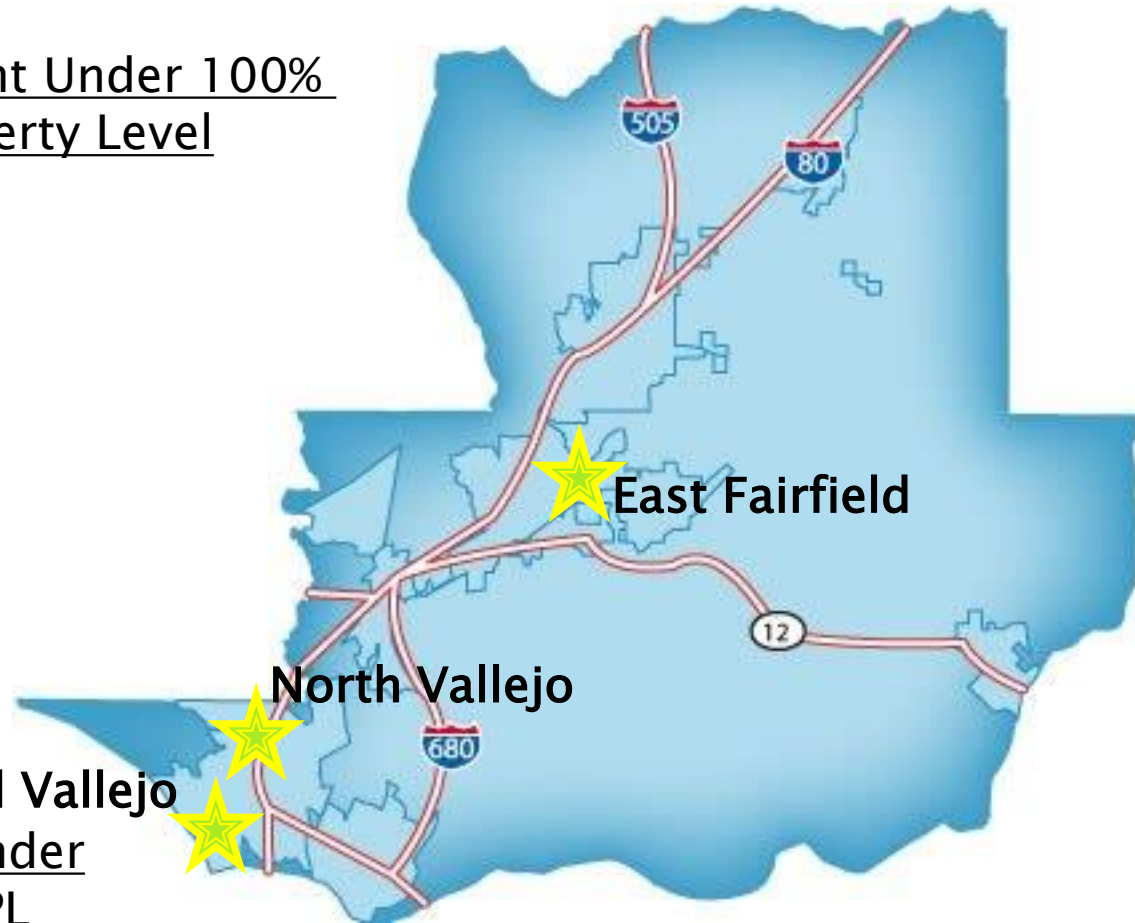

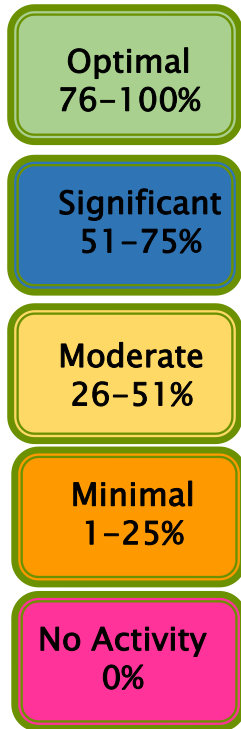

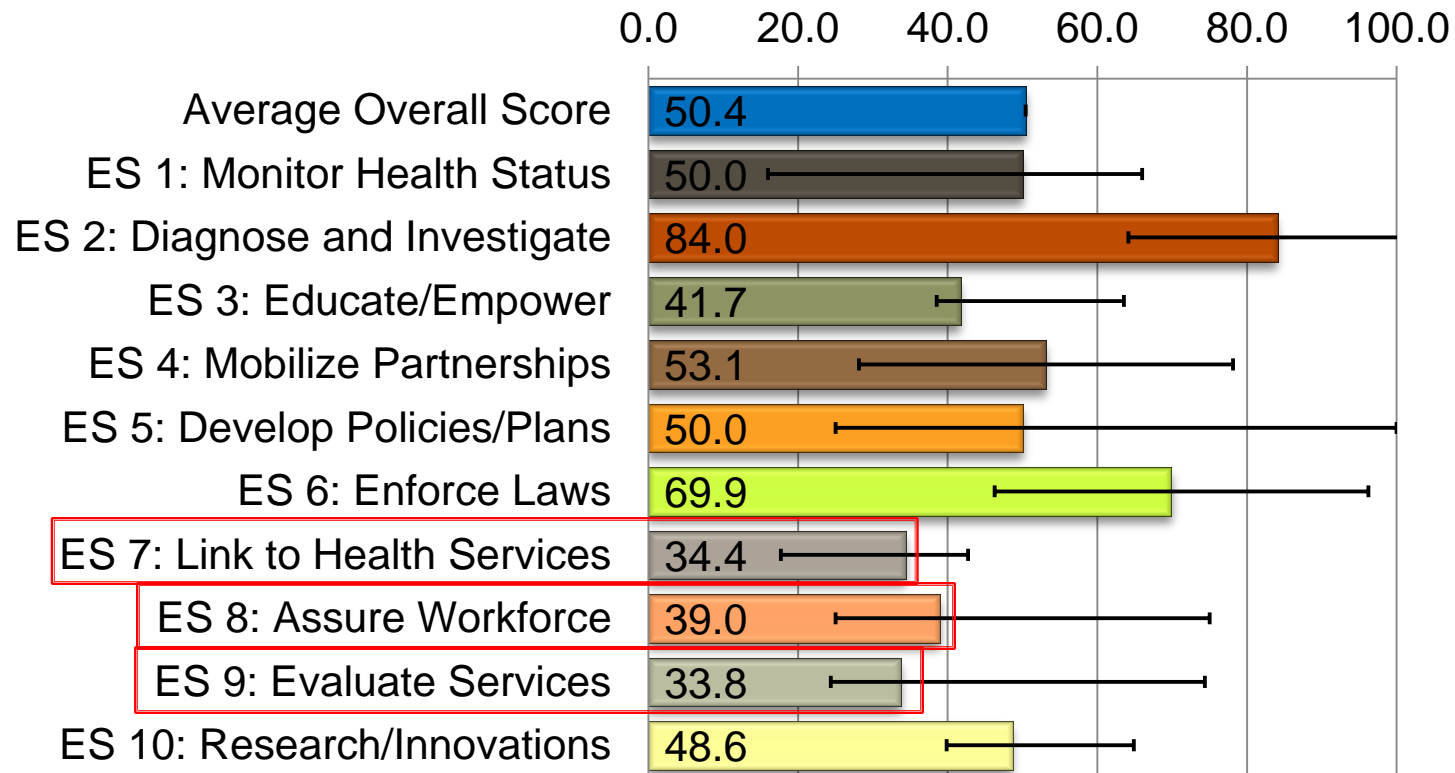
