a. Anaerobic Digestion and the Role of Organics Recycling to Achieve CA's 75% Solid Waste Diversion Goal Mr. Tim Hall, Environmental Scientist, CalRecycle <u>Timothy.Hall@calrecycle.ca.gov</u> or (916) 341-6175

California disposes more than 30 million tons of waste in landfills each year, of which approximately 40% is compostable organic materials. Greenhouse gas emissions resulting from the decomposition of organic wastes in landfills have been identified as a source of emissions contributing to global climate change. Anaerobic decomposition of organic materials in landfills produces methane (CH4), a greenhouse gas with global warming potential approximately 25x higher than carbon dioxide (CO2). Landfills emit the majority of manmade methane emissions in California. The California State Legislature has set ambitious goals for reducing the amount of organic materials sent to landfills and increasing diversion of these materials to composting and anaerobic digestion. This presentation provides an overview of California laws that require diversion and recycling of organic waste and how anaerobic digestion can help achieve these goals."
