Re: Parole Board hearing for Inmate Marciel Dayrit, CDCR# D20060

On September 7, 2017, a Board of Parole Hearing was held at the California State Prison-Solano in Vacaville, California for inmate Marciel Dayrit, convicted by jury of the brutal murder of 17 year old Christopher Rond and the attempted murder and assault with a deadly weapon on Christopher's friends. On June 22, 1984, Marciel Dayrit and some of his gang members went to a party at a house on Cordelia Road. Christopher Rond was there with two of his friends and when Dayrit and his gang started flashing knives and causing trouble, Christopher and his friends tried to stop the bullying. Christopher and his friends decided to leave the party but were chased down by Dayrit and his gang. Christopher's friends were attacked and suffered slashing injuries but survived the attack. Christopher was pulled from the driver's seat of his car, held by the neck by one of the gang members while Dayrit and another gang member repeatedly stabbed Christopher. Dayrit and his gang then stomped on Christopher while he lay dying on the ground outside his car. Christopher was stabbed more than a dozen times and his last words to his attackers was a plea for them to stop because they were killing him and if they didn't stop he was going to die. Christopher Rond died on the ground outside his car while Dayrit and his gang fled the area.

Marciel Dayrit was sentenced to 26 years to life in December 1985, and this was his fifth parole board hearing since he was incarcerated. Christopher Rond's mother, father, and two sisters have attended every parole hearing for Marciel Dayrit and the hearings of the two co-defendants also sentenced to life terms. Deputy District Attorney Elizabeth Ring attended the hearing and joined the family in objecting to the release of inmate Dayrit because he continues to represent an unreasonable risk of safety to the community. The Board of Parole agreed and denied parole. Marciel Dayrit will be eligible for another parole board hearing in 5 years.
