# SECOND TERM AS VICE-CHAIR AND BOARD MEMBER ASSIGNMENTS

The Board of Supervisors unanimously chose me to be the Vice-Chair of the Board at the January 7<sup>th</sup> Board meeting. I was also assigned to represent the county on several boards and commissions. I was chosen to serve on the In-home Support Services Advisory Board, the Mental Health Advisory Board, the Solano Land Trust, the Solano Children's Alliance, the Area Agency on Aging, the Yolo-Solano Air Quality Board, the Regional Planning Committee for the Association of Bay Area Governments, Solano County Water Agency, and as the alternate for the California Association of Counties, Marin Clean Energy Board of Directors, and the Executive Board of the Association of Bay Area Governments. I look forward to continuing my work for Solano County on these organizations.

#### **ISSUES TO BE ADDRESSED**

At the January 7 meeting, I requested that the Board receive information on the following items: (1). What the county will be doing with the \$400,000 we received in public safety shutoff money, (2) The status of the report promised to the Board members about the veteran's halls in Solano County, (3) The resolution for approval of home kitchen enterprises (which is the final step in the approval process) and (4) What will be done to ensure short-term rentals comply with regulations and don't negatively impact the community. I expect to see these issues addressed soon.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS IN GREEN VALLEY AND UNINCORPORATED VALLEJO

On Tuesday January 14<sup>th</sup>, the Board of Supervisors approved infrastructure improvements in both Green Valley and unincorporated Vallejo. These will be sidewalk improvements, replacing cracked concrete gutters and adding new sidewalks. These improvements are worth \$1.5 million.

The City Council passed an ordinance mandating smoke-free multifamily housing. This is one of the strongest smoking prevention ordinances in Solano County. This is a great achievement for the health and safety of our community. I was unfortunately unable to attend, but my staff represented me at this event.

On the evening of Friday January 24<sup>th</sup>, I thoroughly enjoyed the Benicia Chamber of Commerce installation dinner. The dinner was held at the Benicia Clocktower. The Chamber installed their new officers for 2020. The salmon was amazing.

#### BENICIA LION'S CLUB CRAB FEED

I attended my first crab feed of the season with the Benicia Lion's club. It was held at the Portuguese Hall in Benicia. I had a wonderful time meeting people and being with friends.

#### FINDING SOLUTIONS TO FLOODING IN FAIRFIELD

For the past few years, I have been working on resolving flooding issues in Cordelia and Green Valley. I was able to secure funding through the Solano County Water Agency for a Fluvial Geomorphologist to survey the creek in Green Valley and determine what needs to be done to resolve flooding issues. I am so happy we are making progress on this issue. ### **CONTRIBUTIONS AT 01/28/2020 BOARD MEETING**

At the 01/28/2020 Board meeting, an item was approved by the Board from my office budget to donate to the following community organizations: Benicia Panthers Band Boosters (\$750); Rodriguez High School Education Unit (\$750); Benicia Unified School District (\$1,750): \$250 to the High School Debate Team, \$750 to Robert Semple Elementary for school supplies for the teachers, and \$750 to Mary Farmar Elementary School for supplies for the teachers; Vallejo School District (\$1,000): \$500 to Glen Cove Elementary School and \$500 to Pennycook Elementary School, both for school supplies for teachers; Benicia Community Action Council (\$250); Eric Reyes Foundation (\$125); Kyle Hyland Foundation (\$125) and Humane Society of the North Bay (\$250).

## HOUSING COORDINATOR IN SOLANO COUNTY

The Board has previously approved a hiring a housing coordinator for Solano County. The purpose of this position is to help the county take a more active role in providing affordable housing in the county.
