

SUPERVISOR MONICA BROWN CORONAVIRUS UPDATE #3 (03/27/2020)

Hello Benicia, Fairfield and Vallejo,

Thank you for taking the time to read my updates about the Coronavirus. I would like to provide you with another update as well as resources available to you. If I can be of any help, please don't hesitate to contact my office at 707-784-3031 or at mesonarchem.

This situation is constantly evolving, and new information arrives regularly. Please check the resources listed to see if there is new information.

I would like to begin with extending a heartfelt thank you to the many people that are helping to keep our County operating. We all understand the difficult times we are in and yet our government workers, first responders, medical staffing, grocery workers and truckers have provided essential services to help the people of our community. Thank you.

Please stay at home unless you are considered essential or going out to get food, groceries, gas, or going to the doctor, or financial institutions. You can walk the dog or go for a walk to get some fresh air as long as you adhere to social distancing which is staying six feet away from others.

If you are out of your home for an essential activity, please remember to socially distance (6 ft away) and to bring hand sanitizer with you. Please wash your hands with soap or use hand sanitizer if soap is unavailable.

I urge you to postpone anything outside of the home that you can postpone. Please remember that for any appointment you may have or any business you wish to conduct, please call ahead to see if the office is open. If they are open, ask whether you can conduct your business online or over the phone. If it is not essential, please postpone it until this crisis has subsided.

Due to public health concerns, the county has closed the lobbies of our departments to the public. Also, many county functions such as the issuance of marriage licenses have been halted during this time.

Please remember that this is a difficult time for all of us. We are all in this together. Please follow all public health guidelines. Please wash your hands (or sanitize if you can't wash with soap right away). When you must leave your home, please remember to practice social distancing (6 ft apart). Please stay safe during this time. Again, if I can be of any assistance to you during this time, please don't hesitate to contact us.

RESOURCES AVAILABLE DURING THIS TIME:

CalFresh Food Program

CalFresh provides benefits to help households purchase the food. The benefits are provided via Electronic Benefits Transmission (EBT) which is accessed by using a card, like a debit card. These cards are accepted at grocery stores, farmer's markets and most other stores that sell food.

CalWORKs Cash Assistance Program

CalWORKs provides cash assistance, housing, utilities, and clothing for families with little or no income. These benefits are issued via EBT card.

Medi-Cal Health Insurance

Medi-Cal health insurance pays for medical services for children and adults with limited income and resources.

General Assistance Programs

General assistance programs provide cash assistance for adults without dependents. These cash benefits are issued via EBT card.

All Solano County community members, regardless of immigration status, may apply for these programs if they are eligible. For more information about immigration and these safety net supports, visit https://www.solanocounty.com/depts/hss/publiccharge

Most applications for these programs will be accepted and processed remotely while Shelter at Home Orders are in effect due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19). After an application is submitted, the applicant will be contacted by phone to schedule a phone interview, which may be on the same day. Applications may be obtained and submitted as follows:

- Pick Up / Drop Off Application: Community members are strongly encouraged to apply online or request an application by phone. However, this may not be possible in some cases.
