It is with a heavy hear that I announce we recently had another resident pass away from Covid-19. The person was in their 90s and had been hospitalized for nearly a month. It is always difficult to hear that we have lost someone to Covid-19. My condolences to the individual's family. This update is dedicated to their memory.

SOLANO ORDERED TO CLOSE INDOOR DINING

The Governor announced today that 19 counties (including Solano) are required to scale back the reopening. We are required to close indoor operations at restaurants (outdoor, delivery and carryout is still allowed), wine & tasting rooms, movie theaters, family entertainment centers, zoos and museums. Bars are required to close completely.

The Governor made this decision because the impacted counties recently saw rising hospitalizations and rising cases of covid-19. The statewide positivity rate (the percentage of Covid-19 tests that are positive) has gone up to 6%. The Governor indicated that this is alarming.

TESTING

Please get tested for Covid-19. Solano County has two testing sites. One at the Alan Witt Complex in Fairfield and the other at the Norman King Center in south Vallejo. I have been tested twice, I was tested on June 12th at the Norman King Center and I was tested this past Monday (June 29th) at the Fairfield site. My first test was negative, and I am awaiting the second results.

I cannot overstate the importance of getting tested for Covid-19. Testing will allow us to see who has the virus, ask them to quarantine, get them treatment quicker and track all their contacts so they can get tested. This is crucial for slowing the spread of the virus.

Anyone may be tested. You do not need a doctor's note and you do not need insurance. If you have insurance, your insurance will be billed. If you do not have insurance, the state will pay for your test.
