As you probably heard, we are experiencing a surge in the number of coronavirus cases. The Governor's order shutting down many indoor businesses in counties on the watchlist has been extended to all counties. All over California, we are seeing the surge in cases driven largely by private gatherings. It is of the utmost importance that we not have large gatherings at our homes during this crisis. The reason private gatherings at homes have been the driver is because masks are not worn, and social distancing is not practiced. Please, do not have large gatherings in your home during this pandemic.

I regret to inform you that we have seen more deaths from coronavirus in Solano County since my last update. It is always difficult to announce that we have lost more Solano residents to Covid-19. My heart goes out to their families. Please honor their memory by taking all necessary steps to stop the spread of Covid-19.

REOPENING SCHOOLS IN CALIFORNIA

The Governor announced today (July 17, 2020) that schools in counties on the watchlist (which Solano County is) would not reopen to in person learning until they met certain criteria. This means that Solano County's schools will most likely be operating via distance learning when they reopen this fall.

As a retired teacher, I understand this issue and it is personal to me. I know my fellow teachers want to be back in the classroom with their students. I know all of us want to get back to a sense of normalcy. However, with the rise in coronavirus cases throughout the state and specifically in Solano County, we must continue to do distance learning. The safety of our students, teachers, school workers and community are of the utmost importance.

TESTING

To be blunt, there is insufficient testing for Covid-19 to meet the need for testing in the community. Demand for testing has soared during the last few weeks because of the surge in cases. The Governor recently announced a prioritization for testing. I wrote to the Governor to express that I do not agree with prioritizing testing.

Community-wide testing is a crucial component to overcoming Covid-19. Every person who wants a test must be able to easily access a test at no cost. Knowing who has Covid-19 in the community will allow us to ask them to quarantine, track who they have been in contact with and find who may have been exposed and get them tested.

The state has provided the testing sites in Solano County. This has been at no cost to the county. I will be asking the county to provide the supervisors with options on what we can do about testing. I also sent a letter to Senator Bill Dodd and Assemblymembers Cecilia Aguiar-Curry, Jim Frazier and Tim Grayson asking for them to advocate for accessible and free community testing.

We are now testing about 1,100 people a day in Solano County. Even at that rate, we do not have enough capacity. As of the last time I checked (Thursday July 16th), no appointments were available within 50 miles of Benicia, Fairfield and Vallejo. All appointments for the appointment window are filled. I will continue to advocate that we expand testing availability for our community. It is extremely important that the state expand testing capacity for our community.

CORONAVIRUS STATISTICS

The county has added the positivity rate to the dashboard. Currently, Solano County is at an 8.4% positive rate. This means that for every 100 people tested, 8.4 are positive. This number is going in the wrong direction. We must do everything we can to stop the spread of the virus (wear a face covering).

In addition to increased positives, we are seeing increased hospitalizations. This indicates that expanded testing alone does not explain for the surge in coronavirus cases. If testing were the only reason, the newly discovered cases would be asymptomatic and would not be in the hospital. I cannot emphasize enough how important it is for us to stop the spread of the virus.

VOTING DURING CORONAVIRUS

The surge in our numbers comes as we enter the November election. It is extremely important that everyone can cast their vote safely and conveniently. A law state law was passed this year that will require sending every voter a ballot by mail that can be mailed back in. In Solano County, 76% of our voters already receive a ballot by mail. However, voters are not required to use the ballot that is mailed to them.

The options for voting in the upcoming November election are: (1) Return your ballot by mail. (2) Drop your ballot off at one of the voting centers or designated ballot drop-off locations. (2) Download a ballot and print it at home then mail it, fax it or drop it off at a drop-off location. (3) You can request to vote curbside at your polling place from your vehicle. A poll worker will come out to your car with your ballot and securely deposit it for you after your fill it out. You can also bring your mail in ballot to your polling place on election day and a poll worker can come out to your car and get your mail in ballot for you. (4) You can drop off your ballot at any polling place in the county on election day. (5) If you prefer the traditional same-day voting experience, you may go to your polling place, receive a ballot and vote that day at the polling place. Social distancing and masks will be used with this option as well as all health and safety guidelines.

In every election previously, I voted at the polls. I enjoyed the experience of going to my local polling place, seeing my fellow community members and casting my ballot surrounded by my neighbors. It was always a fun experience. However, given the Covid-19 situation, I may decide to use a different option. Rather than standing in line, most likely I will fill out my mail-in ballot and drop it off at my local polling place on election day.

If you are in the high-risk group such as over 65 (I am) or with a serious medical condition, you may want to consider avoiding going to the polls this year. Our coronavirus numbers are only going up and we should avoid gathering as much as possible.
