Every voter will be mailed a ballot and you may mail it back in, drop it off at a designated ballot drop box or election day polling place, drop it off curbside at a designated curbside location or drop it off curbside at a polling place. You may also download a ballot and fax it back to the Registrar or mail it back to the registrar. You may also go to your polling place and vote in person. You should bring your mail in ballot to surrender if you plan to vote in person. Otherwise, you may be required to vote using a provisional ballot. A provisional ballot will be placed in a special envelope and your vote will be counted after it is verified that you did not already vote in this election.
