CORONAVIRUS NUMBERS

I know how taxing this crisis has been on all of us. We are all tired of the toll this has taken on us. We are in the worst days of this pandemic. Our positivity rate, hospitalizations, number of active cases, and all metrics are far too high. We are starting to see the impact of the Thanksgiving holiday gatherings.

As I have said many times, private gatherings are the largest driver of the spread of coronavirus in our community. When contact tracing is done on those infected, we see that the overwhelming majority report a private gathering as the source of their infection.

I know I say this often, but it bears repeating. Please do not attend private gatherings. IF you do attend a private gathering (which you should not), please wear masks, stay 6ft apart, hold the event outside, get tested before and after the event (and stay away if you are positive), limit the number of people who attend, and do not attend if you are over 65, are sick, and/or have a pre-existing health condition.

The ICU capacity for our region is fast approaching the level that will require us to shutdown outdoor dining and require retail establishments to further limit their capacity. I would not be surprised if we reach that level today or this weekend.
