Executive Summary

Solano County (the County) does not currently have an approved or authorized project to report in this submission of the U.S. Department of the Treasury's State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) Recovery Plan. Most recently, on June 22nd, 2021 (Agenda Item #21-503) the County's Board of Supervisors (BOS) received an update on the \$86.9 million American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding category options and provided further direction on the process for development of expenditure/investment plan for fiscal year (FY) 2021/22. Our efforts are not to rush a recovery plan but to be deliberate and inclusive by receiving public input, working with other agencies/municipalities to pool resources and avoid duplication where joint projects provide a mutual benefit are shared as priorities, and to ensure there are projects that will impact future generations.
