Gloria started career as a Chicano movement activist in the 1970s before becoming the first Latina elected to the California Assembly in 1982. Gloria then became the first Latina elected to the Los Angeles City Council and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.

Gloria pushed for Latino and women's rights during her career.

Caltrans in coordination with Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit (SMART) has scheduled a closure of State Route 37 (SR-37) east of State Route 121 (Lakeville Highway) from **Saturday, May 20th, at 3am, until Sunday, May 21st, at 11am**, to allow SMART to repair a railroad crossing on the highway.

Traffic will be detoured around the closures. Eastbound traffic from Marin County may travel as far as SR-121 (Lakeville Highway). Westbound traffic from Solano County can travel as far as Walnut Avenue in Vallejo before diverting onto city streets.

Detour details:

- Motorists heading westbound will take Highway 29 to Highway 12, then take Highway 121/Arnold Drive to Highway 37.
- Motorists heading eastbound will take Highway 121/Arnold Drive to Highway 12, then Highway 29 to Highway 37.
 Westbound drivers may also continue on Highway 12 to Interstate 80.

The Superior Court of Solano County, is seeking volunteers to serve as jurors on the 2023-2024 Civil Grand Jury. Residents who have lived in the county for one year, are a United States citizen and are 18 years of age or older, may apply for service.

The grand jury serves an important role in our society, functioning as an arm of the judicial branch of government and operates under the authority of the Solano Superior Court. The grand jury investigates and reports on the operations, accounts, and records of local government and has the power to investigate citizen complaints about local government.

Grand jurors are paid a \$20 per diem and are paid mileage reimbursement for each authorized meeting. Cycle 8 Participatory Budgeting (PB) vote underway

The city of Vallejo announced the Cycle 8 Participatory Budgeting vote will be held until June 30. Residents are allowed to vote for up to two projects on the 10-proposal ballot. Projects are either infrastructure (e.g., park updates, street safety improvements, etc.) and programs and services (e.g., youth programs, spay and neuter services, etc.)

FAST changes

The city of Fairfield's transit service (FAST) will be increasing local fares by \$0.25 effective July 1 becoming the first fare increase for the transit agency since 2014.

FAST also announced that it will no longer be selling 31-day paper passes for fixed-route services effective July 1, however, paper passes purchased before July 1 may be used through December 31, 2023.

Passengers may still pay cash for their fare but will be encouraged to purchase their local pass using the regional Clipper Card payment system.

A paratransit DART fare will increase from \$3.50 to \$4.

For City Boards and Commissions, except for the Beautification, Civil Service, Human Relations, McCune Collection, and Sister City Commissions, and the Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee, all appointed members must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interests, Form 700, within 30 days of appointment. All City Board and Commission members must complete AB 1234 Ethics training and file a Certificate of Completion within 30 days of appointment.

In most instances, to be eligible for appointment, applicants must be residents of the City of Vallejo. Information regarding the duties of each board and commission and specific criteria for appointment may be found within each application. With some exceptions, appointments are typically for a term of 4 years.

The application period will close on **Wednesday**, **May 31st**, **at 5 pm**.

Congratulations to Dixon High School math teacher Cheyanne Freitas who was named as one of seven finalists for the 2023 Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST) by Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond!

The PAEMST awards honor exemplary science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and/or computer science teachers from across the United States. In 2023, eligibility was limited to teachers of grades 7-12.

"The PAEMST is the highest honor bestowed by the U.S. government specifically for kindergarten through grade twelve science, mathematics, engineering, and computer science teaching," according to the California Department of Education.

The finalists will receive a \$10,000 special award from the National Science Foundation at a ceremony in Washington, D.C.
