Updates from around Solano County Benicia Water line update



On Thursday, Benicia residents and business owners received some good news as the city set the water conservation at 20 percent. Officials had set the conservation rate at 40 percent when a transmission line was damaged due to a hillside collapse near I-680 and Gold Hill Road on

March 29.

Officials also announced the successful installation of a water bypass line, which will be expanded to accommodate summer water usage. Benicia officials said that plans for permanent repairs for the main line are being conducted in partnership with the city of Fairfield. The repairs are expected to take more than a year.

This programs helps to better prepare commercial farmers, ranchers, ag processors, and horse stable operators in the event of natural disasters and pre-approves entrance to evacuation areas in emergencies. Next week, the Solano County Public Defender's Office will host the county's first ever Clean Slate Day on **Friday, April 28** from **10am to 3pm** in the courtyard between 355 and 365 Tuolumne Street in Vallejo.

The event will help individuals clear any past records of felony and misdemeanor arrests and convictions.

Attorneys and paralegals from the Public Defender and Alternate Defender will be available to provide advice and assist with preparing petitions for relief. The event will feature several community organizations to help connect participants with services, including employment assistance, drug treatment, mental health treatment, voter registration, medical care, GED classes, financial literacy and benefits.
