

## State Sen. Bill Dodd issues statement on California Forever project



Sen. Bill Dodd, D-Napa, issued the following statement regarding the announcement from developers of the proposed California Forever community in Solano County that they would soon begin collecting signatures for a ballot initiative to get their project built:

"They've certainly put plenty of money and time into their proposal but there are still huge, unresolved issues like traffic, and I'm not sold," Dodd said. "If the measure qualifies, Solano County voters will get to weigh in on whether they think it's a good idea. I hope decisions are based on facts, not slogans, misdirection and massive campaign spending. We shouldn't gloss over very important public policy considerations that will have generational impacts." **(**707) 784-8960



#### **Benicia's economic situation**



2024 will be a pivotal year for the city of Benicia as the municipality will need to eliminate \$6.5 million in programs and services to remain solvent.

In January, the city will hold a series of meetings and engagements for the community to share their thoughts on how the city should make those cuts, according to City Manager Mario Giuliani.

"There is no easy fix or magic solution that will keep everything the same as it always has been. We have to make very difficult decisions," Giuliani said. "If we are willing to sacrifice today, then our resiliency will, by the end of this decade, lead to fiscal vibrancy so we may enhance the services and surroundings of our amazing community.

"I know these days are hard, but we will persevere," Giuliani added.

#### Kaiser Permanente's new Community Health Care Program



This month, Kaiser Permanente launched the <u>Community Health</u> <u>Care Program</u> (CHCP) in California for people who do not have access to any other health coverage. Individuals do not need to be U.S. citizens to qualify.

CHCP members will get the Kaiser Permanente Platinum 90 HMO plan. Monthly premiums for comprehensive coverage are subsidized, and members do not have to pay copays for out-ofpocket costs for most care.

## The deadline to apply for CHCP is January 31, 2024, and space is limited.

Solano County, in collaboration with Napa/Solano Area on Aging and Innovative Health Solutions (IHS), has unveiled the Solano Master Plan for Aging (MPA), a strategic initiative to address the evolving needs of the growing population of older and disabled adults in Solano County. The plan is shaped with active input from community leaders and professionals to ensure a targeted, impactful approach.

#### A public meeting is scheduled from 9:30 to 11:30am, Tuesday, January 30, inside the Solano County Events Center, 601 Texas Street.

The MPA is a proactive response to the observable diversification and accelerated growth of the older adult population in Solano County and the State of California. In the next decade, the number of older adults in Solano County is expected to double, representing 20% of the county's population. The plan outlines evidence-based approaches and five strategic plan goals to address this demographic shift and its unique challenges.

#### Do you know how to stop scammers?

Scam artists are in Solano County and they're throwing everything they've got at us. With the advent of new technologies—including images and voices generated by Artificial Intelligence— sophisticated fraudsters are able and willing to do nearly anything for a quick buck, from down the street or across the globe. *Are you prepared to fight back?* 

To help you do just that, Solano County's Older & Disabled Adult Services (ODAS) has launched the <u>Solano Senior Fraud</u> <u>Prevention Center</u>, a repository for all the information residents might need to prevent financial elder abuse, empower seniors and stop scammers in their tracks.

There, you'll learn the key signs you might be the target of a scammer: Is someone giving you a threat? Are they pushing you to do something costly or asking you to provide private information? Is there a tight deadline or an unbelievable offer? Does that image look a little off—or does that voice sound a bit robotic? If you answered yes to at least one, delete that email, log-off or hang-up!

The Solano LAFCO seeks Letters of Interest and Applications for the Alternate Public Member position with the deadline set for **5pm**, **Thursday, February 8**. The Alternate Public Member represents the point of view of the general public. The Indvidual must be a resident of Solano County; may not be an officer or employee of the County or a city in Solano County.

LAFCO is a five-member commission comprised of two members of the Board of Supervisors, two Mayors from cities within Solano County, and a Public Member. There is an alternate for each category who serves and votes in place of regular members if they are absent or disqualified from participating due to a conflict of interest. The Alternate Public Member is appointed and serves at the pleasure of the regular members of the Commission.

LAFCO is charged with preserving agricultural land and open space, providing for orderly boundaries and efficient municipal services, and discouraging urban sprawl.

The commission will meet the second Monday of February, April, June, August, October, and December in the Board of Supervisor's Chambers at 10am at 675 Texas Street in Fairfield. Members receive a stipend of \$100/meeting up to two meetings per month.





The Navy was in transition from a time when ship's officers punished errant sailors by flogging them with a "cat o' nine tails." Following an 1850 congressional ban on flogging, the Navy experimented with alternative punishments, but it soon became clear a land-based prison system was needed.




#### **Book Club**

The Solano Commission for Women and Girls and the Friends of the Commission for Women and Girls will host the third annual Birth Justice Solano event on February 25.



Recent statistics underscore the urgency of our mission. Black and brown women face alarming maternal mortality rates, with black women being more than three times as likely to die from pregnancy-related causes than their white counterparts. In Solano County, these disparities persist, highlighting the need for immediate attention and action. Birth Justice is not just an event; it is a response to a critical healthcare challenge that demands our collective commitment.
