Selina Solomons and Hannah Marks Solomons

A member of the first graduating class of the San José Normal School was Hannah Marks Solomons. Solomons served as the representative for San Francisco's Jewish women at an 1888 meeting to decide if women should be allowed on the Board of Education. Solomons' daughter Selina became active in the California suffrage movement and worked specifically to attract more working-class women to the cause, along with publishing an account of the 1911 victory entitled "How We Won the Vote in California".

Selina Solomons devoted her life to women's suffrage and was a key player with California passing its eighth amendment that

Solano Transportation Authority Board authorizes proceeding with SR 37/Fairgrounds Interchange Project Construction



Earlier this month, the Solano Transportation Authority (STA) Board authorized STA (partnered with the City of Vallejo, County of Solano, and Caltrans) to proceed with construction on the State Route 37/Fairgrounds Interchange Project, an independent component project to improve the I-80/I-680/I-780 transportation corridor.

This project will provide improved and safer access for autos, express buses, bikes, and pedestrians accessing Six Flags, the Solano 360 Development, and the adjacent neighborhoods. The interchange improvements include a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) strategy. Some advantages of a DDI include:

- Free vehicles left turns onto SR 37
- Ramp termini intersections can operate with two signal phases instead of three
- Reduce intersection delay particularly for the movement to the WB SR 37 on-ramp
- Better accommodates future traffic demand
- Smaller construction footprint
- Lower cost due to the elimination of all proposed retaining walls
- Increase safety for pedestrians and bicyclists
- Separated pedestrian path

Youth Ride Free



Beginning, Monday, April 1, 2024, all youth ages 6-18 will have free fares on all Solano County Transit (SolTrans) Local Routes and SolanoExpress Lines.

This is a pilot program that will run from April 2024 through June 2025. In the Spring of 2025, staff will return to the SolTrans Board with directions on whether to fully adopt the Youth Free Fare or not. The pilot's goals are to promote access to public transit to a new generation, increase attendance at the local school districts, and grow ridership.



City of Fairfield to no longer pay credit convenience fees on behalf of customers



Beginning May 1, the city of Fairfield will no longer pay credit card convenience fees on behalf of customers. In the past, the city absorbed these fees as a courtesy to residents and businesses making payments. Instead, the fee charge will be passed on to customers who choose to pay with a credit card.

To avoid these fees, customers are encouraged to make payments using check, cash, or Automated Clearing

House (ACH) transfers. These payment methods do not incur convenience fees.

Internship for high school students

Bay Area high school students are invited to apply to the Norman Mineta Bay Area Summer Academy, a five-week paid internship with MTC, the



Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), the Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District).

The program kicks off at the Bay Area Metro Center on July 8, 2024, and over the course of the subsequent five weeks, students will learn how regional agencies deals with issues like environmental justice, housing and transportation equity, community health, and social justice. High school students are encouraged to apply before the application deadline on April 28, 2024.(link is external)

To apply for the Bay Area Summer Academy, students must:

- Live and attend high school in the Bay Area.
- Be at least 16 years old.
- Have completed the ninth grade by July 2024.
- Be able to attend online and in-person seminars and present on a topic related to the seminars.
- Have the permission of a parent or guardian to participate if the student is under 18.

Enrollment is limited, and selections will emphasize a diversity of perspectives from students across the Bay Area. Grade point averages are not considered.

Notice of Public Availability of 2023 Refinery Flare Minimization Plan Annual Updates

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District is releasing the 2023 Flare Minimization Plan (FMP) Annual Updates for public review and comment. The five Bay Area refineries prepared these plans subject to Regulation 12, Rule 12: Flares at Refineries.

Under Regulation 12-12, each FMP Annual Update must include:

 New prevention measures identified during investigations of flaring events that occurred during the period July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023;

- A description of the prevention measures previously taken or currently planned to reduce flare emissions at the refinery;
- Commitment to implement all new feasible prevention measures expeditiously; and
- A 30-day public comment review period

The plan updates are now available for review on the Air District's Flare Minimization Plans web page.

The deadline to submit public comments regarding the 2023 FMP Annual Updates is **April 8, 2024**.

Be sure to identify which refinery, or refineries, your comment is applicable to.

After consideration of public comments received, the Air District will evaluate each refinery's Flare Minimization Plan Annual Update to determine whether it meets the requirements of Regulation 12-12 and will take final action in accordance with the regulation.

The <u>CalMatters College Journalism Network</u> is hiring fellows for its 2024-2025 cohort, which begins mid-August and runs through May.

training in reporting, higher education policy and navigating the journalism industry.

Fellows devote an average of 10-15 hours per week to the remote fellowship, with a flexible schedule and a stipend of \$1200 per month. Expect to attend weekly, virtual newsroom meetings with the rest of the CJN team, and at least one in-depth, expenses-paid training in Sacramento at the beginning of the program.



The Benicia City Council has appointed a Council Subcommittee consisting of Vice Mayor Terry Scott and Councilmember Kari Birdseye, with Fire Chief Josh Chadwick to create an Industrial Safety and Health Ordinance (ISO) for the city of Benicia.

through March and includes a pre-trip presentation through our School Water Education Program and a field trip to a local park or outdoor space. This program is available to 3rd grade classes in Solano County.





Solano County receives reports about misleading signature gatherers



The Solano County Registrar of Voters (ROV) is issuing this alert to inform voters of their rights, officials announced this week. The County has received multiple reports of voters being misinformed by circulators collecting signatures either with incorrect information or for a petition to **stop** the East Solano Homes, Jobs and

Clean Energy Initiative (also known as "California Forever"). No such initiative has been cleared for circulation.

"Only one local initiative has been approved for circulation - and that petition is to authorize rezoning of 17,500 acres of Solano County agricultural land for a new community," said Tim Flanagan, Chief Information Officer and Registrar of Voters. "Anyone who signed a petition and wishes to withdraw their signature may do so by contacting our office. The freedom to petition your government through the initiative process is central to our democracy. We strongly encourage voters to carefully read petitions before signing them to ensure they are acting on their convictions instead of misinformation."

If voters feel they signed a petition in error, they may withdraw their signatures from a petition with a written request to the ROV. Access the withdrawal of signature from petition form by clicking <u>HERE</u>. Voters who wish to file a complaint regarding signature gathering tactics may do so with the <u>Secretary of State or Solano County</u>.

Disposables are dangerous even when empty. Cylinders often still contain a small amount of gas, posing a danger to sanitation workers due to the risk of explosions and resulting fires.

The state of California offers a propane cylinder recycling program called Refuel Your Fun & Save/Choose Reusables! This program promotes the safety of propane cylinders by choosing refillables instead of disposables. Refillables reduce the impact on landfills and the environment.
