

### Crack Sealing the Airport Terminal Building Parking Lot – Wed October 16

Airport management has received word that County Public Works staff will be on site Wednesday October 16<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM, crack sealing the pavement in front of the Terminal Administration Building. This treatment helps prolong the life of the pavement from 3-5 years. We apologize in advance for the inconvenience, but we will not be able to have any cars parked on that lot during the work from 7 AM to 5 PM. Signs will be posted directing customers to park in the field in front of the Rowland Freedom Center. Thank you for your help and cooperation.

# Nut Tree Airport Advisory Committee (NTAAC) Meeting

The next Nut Tree Advisory Committee Meeting will be held in the Airport conference room on October 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6:00 PM. An agenda for the meeting will be sent out to all Nut Tree tenants and businesses prior to the meeting. The meeting will include a presentation by Paul Koscheka an Agency Manager with the FAA who will be speaking about friendly flying practices.

### Taxilane Reconstruction

Great news – Nut Tree Airport received all of its FAA requested grant dollars - \$2.66 Million – for the next phase of the Northeast Hangar Taxilane Reconstruction, Phase 2A. We also have received another \$132,000 from the State in matching funds. It was no small effort to make that happen and involved close work on the part of the County's Purchasing staff, County Counsel and Mead & Hunt, and of course, your Airport staff.

The contractor for the project, OC Jones & Son, has been awarded the contract and will be starting the construction next Spring 2025, once the rains have ended and the ground is dried out.

Staff will be holding a special meeting in the next few weeks to go into more details about the project and to seek input on construction processes and procedures. The date will be announced by email.

## Preventative Maintenance on the Airfield

As we transition from Summer months to Fall and Winter months, Airport staff would appreciate help from our tenants in observing any preventative maintenance issues that need attention. Please let staff know if you see drains with potential clogging issues, or light fixtures on either the apron or runway that are not working properly. We ask that you be mindful of opening large hangar doors in windy conditions above 20 mph, which historically has caused significant and costly issues to the doors. Staff also asks your help in notifying them if any hangar maintenance is needed on County hangars. We'd like to complete it before the start of the rainy weather. Your help in this regard is appreciated!

### Young Eagles

Young Eagles will be holding their next event on Saturday, October 19<sup>th</sup> from

8:00 AM to 11:00 AM, with their final event scheduled for November 16<sup>th</sup> (depending on weather). This year they have flown a total of 116 kids, with 25 pilots and a total of 27 volunteers. We are grateful for those who have volunteered their time and efforts to make this a successful season for the Young Eagles and to help kids experience the excitement of aviation.

### Transition from Epic to World Oil

On July 25th, World Oil Services signed an agreement to acquire Epic Fuels, which is the Airport's contracted fuel provider. The formal transition from Epic to World Oil took place on October 1<sup>st</sup>. World Oil Services has assumed the terms of our current fuel contract through 2025. We do not anticipate any changes to the fuel or services that we provide to tenants, but you may notice some new signage on the airfield.
