I.	CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL The meeting was called to order by Rachelle Jackson at 4:30 pm. A quorum was attained.

	b. MH Related Legislation Tracy Lacey informed us that you can now use MHSA funds for co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders programs and if we use MHSA we will be required to report data to the State.	
	Ms. Lacey wanted to let public know that the 800-lifeline suicide hotline number will eventually become a three-digit phone number. The mechanism to pay for a new number has not been determined in California. Counties are exploring housing regional call centers to answer crisis line and do general access line.	

c. LPS/PES Meeting Discussion

Heather Theaux-Venezio said they had a good LPS/PES meeting. They received great feedback about PEDs and Mobile Crisis. They also discussed medic ambulance 5150 transports, work with law enforcement to decriminalize mental health, Kate Grammy working on a behavioral health emergency protocol that will be shared at the July EMS meeting. Ms. Theaux-Venezio would like to see private insurance companies offer crisis after care services similar to programs that Solano County offers.

VI. | PUBLIC COMMENTS

Patty Phillips, NAMI would like a program similar to the one developed by Officer Jeremy Johnson of the Vacaville Police Department for the City of Vacaville to be developed for all cities in Solano County. It is a database that law enforcement has access to that includes client's diagnosis, residence, useful tips on how to approach clients, i.e. exiting 5250 etc.

Ms. Phillips will send Supervisor Monica Brown information about the program Vacaville has for her to review.

Tracy Lacey suggested having Officer Jeremy Johnson present at the LPS/PES meeting and highlight success of program to see if other cities are interested before mandating cities.

VII. STAFF REPORTS

1. Director's Report

There were no updates during this meeting.

2. MHSA Report

Tracy Lacey provided an update on the behavioral health commercials. There will be a total of nine commercials, three commercials for each language: English, Spanish, and Tagalog. They will air on Xfinity and local channels as well as ads during live streaming.

Innovations Community Program Planning Update – talked about the stakeholder meetings that will be taking place in September.

The PADs Project could potentially be selected if stakeholders agree. Funding would only be for up to three years (five with special permissions). Would need a plan on how to sustain once funds run out.

Ms. Lacey suggested starting with paper PADs.

Tracy Lacey will work with Hazel Bright, NAMI and Emery Cowan, Deputy Director Behavioral Health to enlist peers to help start doing paper PADs.

Tracy also provided an update on suicide rates in Solano County. There is a significant issue in Solano County. Suicide rates are higher than state and national rates. In 2020 there was a spike in African American deaths by suicide.

Suicide Prevention Week is September 5, 2021 – September 11, 2021. The Suicide Plan Update will be submitted to Board of Supervisors at the August 24, 2021 meeting.

Mobile Crisis has served 47 members of the community in first month of inception, more than one a day.

	Will have data to share in a few months.
	Student Mobile Crisis update – all six districts have opted in to participate in the MHSSA grant school-based mobile crisis.
	Will launch in the fall when schools reopen.
	We plan to invite Solano County Office of Education to present at the September Mental Health Advisory Board meeting. To be confirmed.
